AN ACT

To authorize Philip Metzgar, Peter Long, and David Longenecker, trustees of the "German Reformed congregation of the borough (now city) of Lancaster," to sell and convey real estate.

Trustees authorized to sell real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Philip Metzgar, Peter Long, and David Longenecker, trustees of the "German Reformed congregation of the city of Lancaster," or their successors in office, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey, by deed or deeds, in fee simple, to Doctor Samuel Humes, of the city of Lancaster, and to his heirs and assigns, all that certain half lot or piece of ground, with the buildings and appurtenances thereto belonging, situate on the south side of Orange street, in the city of Lancaster, in the county of Lancaster, containing in front on Orange street thirty-three feet and six inches, and in depth to a fourteen feet wide alley, two hundred and fifty-two feet, and in front or breadth on said alley, thirty feet ten inches and one-half inch, bounded on the north by Orange street, on the east by property of Doctor Samuel Humes, on the south by said alley, and on the west by property of Henry G. Long, Esquire, being the same which Charles Powell and others, by deed of indenture of the thirtieth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, recorded at Lancaster, in book number twenty-two, at page one hundred and ninety, and so forth, granted and conveyed to the "minister, trustees, elders and deacons of the German Reformed congregation of the city of Lancaster," their successors and assigns, forever.
