SECTION 2. That the expense of arresting, binding over or committing, and keeping such person or persons in the said lock-up house, or conveying him, her or them to the common jail of the county aforesaid, on any indictable offence, shall be paid by the county of York, on the presentation of proper accounts to the commissioners of said county. A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An Act incorporating the Philadelphia college of medicine."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the act, entitled "An Act incorporating the Philadelphia college of medicine," approved January the fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, which restricts the period for the delivery of lectures in said college, be and the same is hereby repealed; and said college is authorized, should it be deemed proper and necessary, to deliver a course of lectures between the months of October and April, in each and every year.
