## AN ACT

To authorize Richard Donaldson to collect certain outstanding tax in the township of Robinson, in the county of Washington.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the warrant which issued to Richard Donaldson, to collect the taxes in the township of Robinson, in the county of Washington, in eighteen hundred and forty-two, by the commissioners of said county, is hereby revived, so that he is hereby authorized, either by himself or his deputy, to exercise all the powers and authorities conferred on him by said warrant, for the space of one year from the date of this act, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.*

## AN ACT

Relating to election districts.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the farm now owned and occupied by Charles D. Buckland, in Clinton township, in the county of Wayne, is hereby annexed to and shall form a part of the township of Canaan, in said county, for all purposes whatever.*

Wayne, Buckland, annexed to Clinton tp.

Monroe, Polk, election officers appointed.

Huntingdon.

SECTION 2. That Philip Kresge be and is hereby appointed judge of the coming spring election, in Polk township, Monroe county, and Joel Berlin and Charles Hawk, inspectors of said election and the constable of Chesnut Hill township is hereby required to give notice of the same.

SECTION 3. That hereafter the qualified voters of Jackson township, Huntingdon county, shall hold their township and general elections at

the house of Robert Barr, now occupied by John Hurst, at M'Alcary's fort, in said township.

SECTION 4. That hereafter the qualified voters of Wayne township, Mifflin county, shall hold their township and general elections at the Mifflin stone school house, in the borough of Newton Hamilton, in said township.

SECTION 5. That the qualified electors of the township of Cumru, Berks. in the county of Berks, shall, at the next township election for constable, then determine by ballot, whether in future their general election shall be held at the public house of Michael U. Nunemaker, in the borough of Reading, or at any other place in said township of Cumru; and each qualified voter may put in a ballot, on the outside of which shall be written or printed the words election district, and on the inside the house or place the elector may desire to vote for, and the general election shall thereafter be held at the house or place for which the highest number of votes may be given; the result of said election shall be certified by the judge and inspectors of the election, and filed in the court of quarter sessions of said county. Cumru to decide by ballot where election is to be held.

SECTION 6. That the qualified electors of the township of Armenia, Bradford. in the county of Bradford, shall hold their general and township elections at the house of John S. Beecher, in said township.

SECTION 7. That the qualified electors of the township of Saucon, Lehigh. in the county of Lehigh, shall, at the next township election for the election of constable, then determine by ballot, the place of holding their general elections.

SECTION 8. That the qualified electors of the borough of Martinsburg, and of the township of North Woodbury, in the county of Blair, shall hold their general and township elections at the school house, in the said borough.

SECTION 9. That hereafter the qualified electors of the township of Brady, in the county of Huntingdon, shall hold their general and township elections at the mill of James Lane, in said township, and William Rung is hereby appointed Judge, and John R. M'Carthy and Election officers appointed. Pyram Shadle, are hereby appointed inspectors to hold a township election for said township, on the third Friday of March, eighteen hundred and forty-seven, for the purpose of electing the usual township officers for the ensuing year; that the said judge and inspectors shall, in holding and conducting said township election, be governed by the provisions of the act of second of July, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, regulating the elections of this commonwealth.

SECTION 10. That hereafter the qualified voters of Penn township, Huntingdon. in the county of Huntingdon, shall hold their general and township elections at the school house, on the farm of Jacob Broombaugh, in said township; and Isaac Pightail is hereby appointed judge, and Benjamin C. Lytle and William Dean are hereby appointed inspectors, to hold a township election for said township, on the third Friday of March, eighteen hundred and forty-seven, for the purpose of electing the usual township officers for the ensuing year, who shall, in conducting said election, be governed by the general election laws of this commonwealth.
