A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An Act concerning strays."

Extended to Potter county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That all the provisions of the act, entitled "An Act concerning strays," passed the thirteenth day of April, eighteen hundred and seven, be and the same are hereby extended to the county of Potter: *Provided always,* That the said act shall not be so construed as to compel any person to serve as town clerk more than one year in seven.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the several acts of general assembly respecting auctions and auctioneers.

Certain part of an act repealed.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the third section of an act, entitled "A further supplement to the acts of assembly relating to auctions, in the city of Lancaster and other towns in this commonwealth," passed March third, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Mode of proceeding against violation of auction laws.

SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the mode of proceeding against any person for a violation of any of the provisions of the laws relating to auctions and auctioneers, shall be by indictment in the court of quarter sessions of the proper county; and whenever complaints shall be made to any justice of the peace, or alderman of the proper county or city, on oath or affirmation, against any person for violating the provisions of the same, it shall be his duty to issue a warrant for the apprehension of such person, and compel him to enter a recognizance with sufficient sureties, for his appearance at the next court of quarter sessions of the proper county, to answer the said com-

plaint; and any person being thereof duly convicted, shall pay a fine of not less than three hundred nor more than one thousand dollars for each and every offence, at the discretion of the court, together with the costs of prosecution; one-third of which fine shall go to the use of the person or persons lodging the information, and the residue shall be for the use of the commonwealth.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of [the attorney general, or his deputy Attorney general for the proper county, upon complaint to either of them, made under to prepare bill of oath or affirmation, of a violation of any of the provisions of the laws indictment. relating to auctions or auctioneers, or under the direction of the auditor general or state treasurer, to prepare a bill of indictment against the offender or offenders, and present the same to the grand jury then in session, or to the next grand jury which shall assemble in and for the county in which such violation may have taken place; and the attorney general, or his deputy, as the case may be, shall be allowed by the auditor general a compensation, out of the amount collected, not exceed- Compensation. ing ten per cent. on the same.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An Act to encourage the manufacture of iron with coke or mineral coal, and for other purposes."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* so much of the act, entitled "An Act to encourage the manufacture of Lehigh Crane. iron with coke or mineral coal, and for other purposes," as restricts the iron works may Lehigh Crane iron company from holding their lands in more than three hold certain tracts separate tracts, or in more than two counties which adjoin each other, of land. be and the same is hereby repealed: *Provided, That nothing in this* *Proviso.* act shall be construed to increase the whole number of acres which the said company are now by law entitled to hold, and that the number of tracts of land, in addition to what they now hold, which the said company may at any time hold by purchase, shall not exceed twelve.
