AN ACT

Authorizing the commissioners of the township of Brokenstraw, in the county of Warren, to erect a bridge across the Brokenstraw creek, at the village of Youngsville.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That

To erect a bridge over Brokenstraw creek.

The commissioners of roads and bridges, in the township of Brokenstraw, in the county of Warren, be and they are hereby authorized and required, during the present year, to erect and build a good and substantial bridge across the Brokenstraw creek, at the village of Youngsville, in said township, according to such plan as they shall deem most advisable, at the point where the state road leading from Warren to Meadville now crosses the Brokenstraw creek; and the amount of money necessary to construct said bridge, the said commissioners are hereby authorized and required to assess and collect from the township of Brokenstraw, according to the same valuation, and in the same manner as township rates and levies are now assessed and collected; and in addition to the usual rates and levies assessed and collected, or to be assessed and collected for road and bridge purposes, said commissioners shall appoint a collector, who shall have full power to collect and enforce the payment of all such taxes levied and assessed for the aforesaid purpose.

To assess and collect a tax to defray expenses.
