AN ACT

Relative to the estate of Isaac Harman, late of Fayette county.

WHEREAS, Isaac Harman, the illegitimate son of Isabella Butler, of Fayette county, lately died intestate, leaving no wife, issue or father, and without any legal heirs, and seized and possessed of a small estate : Preamble.

And whereas, His mother, Isabella Butler, is the only near relative now living, and is in indigent circumstances; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the claim and interest of the commonwealth, in and to the estate of the said Isaac Harman, deceased, is hereby released to and vested in the said Isabella Butler, in the same manner as if the said estate had descended and come to her from the said Isaac Harman: *Provided,* That whatever costs, if any, attending the escheat of said estate, may have been incurred by the state treasurer, shall be paid and refunded to him by the said Isabella: *And provided further,* That this act shall not be so construed as to release the said estate from the payment of the collateral inheritance tax. Estate vested.

Relative to elections for constable in Allen township, Cumberland county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the voters of Allen township, in the county of Cumberland, shall here-

AN ACT

For the relief of Thomas M'Namara.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Thomas M'Namara one hundred and twenty-two dollars twenty-two hundredths, the amount due him for articles furnished the agents of the state on the Allegheny Portage railroad, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.*
