AN ACT

Concerning the Cumberland Blues, a volunteer corps of infantry in Greene county,
and the Harrison Rangers of Lebanon county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Cumberland the volunteer corps of infantry, entitled the Cumberland Blues, in Blues. Greene county, shall have and be entitled to the same grade in rank, as if originally organized as a company of infantry.

SECTION 2. That the adjutant general is hereby required to furnish, Harrison Rangers upon the requisition of the proper brigade inspector, the usual number to be furnished of rifles and accoutrements for the use of a volunteer company of rifle- with arms. men, in the county of Lebanon; called the Harrison Rangers, out of any unappropriated arms in any of the state arsenals.

AN ACT

For the relief of John Waldron and company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the canal commissioners are hereby authorized and directed to examine the claim of John Waldron and company, who were contractors on section number thirty-six of the Tioga line of the North Branch canal, and settle the same according to justice and equity, and report the facts to the next legislature.
