

district in which said bridge may be situate, then the inhabitants of the districts nearest thereto shall aid in rebuilding said bridge.

Compensation. SECTION 6. The compensation of said supervisors shall not exceed one dollar per day; and the said supervisors shall not be paid for more than five days, in each year, for services rendered in and about the business of the said roads in said township; and the road master of the several districts shall, to the amount of their respective road tax, be allowed the same daily pay as laboring hands receive on the highways, but the said road masters shall receive no other compensation than their respective road taxes.

Election, how to be conducted. SECTION 7. It shall be the duty of the officers of the election in said township, to provide a separate box for each district, for the electors of each district of said township to deposit their votes therein; but no elector shall vote more than one person for road master. When election is closed, the officers thereof shall make return of the election of said road masters to the clerk of said township, who shall truly enter said return in the records of said township.

Repeal. SECTION 8. The existing road laws, so far as they are supplied or altered by this act, are hereby repealed in the aforesaid township of Lenox.

Act relative to path masters in Choconut and Middletown, Susquehanna county, repealed. SECTION 9. That so much of the act, entitled "An Act relating to path masters in the township of Choconut and Middletown, in the county of Susquehanna," passed the eighteenth of March, eighteen hundred and forty-six, as relates to the township of Middletown, in said county, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Duties of township auditors conferred upon borough auditors, as regards fence viewing. SECTION 10. That all the provisions of an act, entitled "An Act for regulating and maintaining line fences, and for other purposes," passed the eleventh day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-two, relating to township auditors, imposing upon them the duties of fence viewers, be and the same is hereby extended to borough auditors.

AN ACT

To confer certain authority upon the commissioners of Columbia county.

Preamble. WHEREAS, During the construction of the county buildings at Bloomsburg, in the county of Columbia, it was recommended to the building committee by the county commissioners and many other disinterested citizens, that fire proofs and other extra work, deemed expedient and advisable, should be constructed while said buildings were being erected:

And whereas, It is but just and proper that the county should contribute for a portion of such extra work, which, by the act of twenty-fourth of February, eighteen hundred and forty-five, the citizens of Bloomsburg were not bound to construct ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the commissioners of Columbia county are hereby authorized to appropriate, out of the county funds of said county, a sum of money, not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars, to pay for the fire proofs and other extra work in and about the new public buildings in Bloomsburg, and for furnishing the same : *Provided*, That no part of the said sum so appropriated shall be paid out of the county treasury before the acceptance of the said buildings for public use.

AN ACT

Relating to the claim of John Gest against the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That it shall be the duty of the county board of Philadelphia county, to investigate the claim of John Gest against said county, for extra services performed by him whilst occupying the office and discharging the duties of register of wills of said county ; and if they shall find anything due said John Gest, they shall have the power of appropriating a sufficient amount to satisfy his claim ; the money so appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of said county.
