AN ACT

In relation to the Lewisburg and Youngstown turnpike road.

Relative to rates
of tolls.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* so much of the eighth section of an act, entitled "An Act to lay out a state road from Karlhaus, in Clearfield county, to Coudersport, in Potter county, by the way of Sinnemahoning, and for other purposes," approved the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, as relates to imposing tolls at all times on certain things therein named, be and the same is hereby repealed; and that from and after the passage of this act, the stockholders of the Lewisburg and Youngstown turnpike company shall charge and receive tolls upon said turnpike, according to the provisions of the eleventh section of the act incorporating said company, approved the twenty-second day of February, eighteen hundred and twelve.

AN ACT

To authorize Jacob N. Miller to sell and convey certain real estate.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, Ann Kauffman, of Lancaster county, by deed in trust, dated the seventeenth day of November, eighteen hundred and forty-five, recorded in the recorder's office, in and for said county of Lancaster, in "deed in trust and bill of sale book," number two, page four hundred and twenty-five, appropriated and gave to Jacob N. Miller, of the city of Lancaster, the sum of five hundred dollars, in trust, to be invested either in real estate or put to interest, as said trustee might think proper, the rents or proceeds thereof, after payment of taxes and expenses, to be annually paid to John J.
