AN ACT

Supplementary to an act incorporating the directors of the poor for the county of Erie.

Poor entitled to relief, to be admitted.

Proviso.

Directors to take charge of a tract of land.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all such poor and indigent persons as shall be entitled to relief, or shall have gained a legal settlement in the county of Erie, shall be admitted into the institution, on an order for that purpose by any one of the directors of the poor of said county, or by any one justice of the peace of said county; and the constables of said county shall be entitled to receive from said directors, for executing an order for the relief or removal of a pauper or paupers, five cents per mile circular, and no more: Provided, That in all cases in which there is more than one order executed by any constable at the same time, for the first order, five cents for each mile circular, for the second, four cents, for the third, three cents, and for any additional number of orders above three, executed at the same time, no mileage shall be allowed.*

SECTION 2. That the directors of the poor of said county be and they are hereby authorized and directed to take charge of the reserved lands on the south shore of lake Erie, east of the borough of Erie, called the Garrison tract, and rent the same, and pay into the treasury of the poor of said county, the net proceeds.
