AN ACT

Providing for the election of a wood corder within the borough of Lebanon.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified voters of the borough of Lebanon, shall, on the third day of March next, and annually thereafter, elect a suitable person as corder or measurer of wood that may be brought for sale within said borough, whose duty it shall be, either by himself or deputy duly appointed by him, to cord or measure, when called upon, any wood sold or offered for sale in said borough; for which services the corder aforesaid shall receive a compensation, to be paid by the vendee, of ten cents for each cord, seven cents for each three-quarters of a cord, and five cents for any less quantity; and in all cases where the wood so sold shall not hold out the full measure which the vendor sold or offered the same at, if the measuring or cording shall be done within twenty-four hours after the sale or offer for sale, as aforesaid, the seller shall forfeit one-half of the amount of the value of the wood so sold or offered for sale, which said forfeit shall be paid to the corder for the use of said borough; and in case of refusal of payment, the corder aforesaid may recover the same by suit, in like manner as other debts of like amount are recoverable, with costs.

AN ACT

Incorporating the guardians of the poor of the city of Pittsburg.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That City councils to within thirty days after the passage of this act, it shall be the duty of elect guardians of the select and common councils of the city of Pittsburg, each respective poor.
