AN ACT

Fixing the place of holding elections in certain townships in Susquehanna and Lehigh counties.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified voters of Franklin township, in the county of Susquehanna, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Rufus Tuttle, in said township.

SECTION 2. That the qualified voters of the township of Washington, in the county of Lehigh, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public house now occupied by David and Charles Peter, in said township.

SECTION 3. That the qualified voters of the township of Lower Macungie, in the county of Lehigh, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public house now occupied by George Keyser, in said township.

SECTION 4. That the qualified voters of the township of Lowhill, in the county of Lehigh, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public house now occupied by Daniel Clouse, in said township.
