AN ACT

To repeal the eleventh and twelfth sections of an act, entitled "An Act to change the township lines of Lake and Lehman, in the courts of Luzerne, and for other purposes; relative to carrying convicts to the penitentiary from Luzerne county, and the prothonotary, clerk of the county, supervisors of Lehman township, and the appointment of flour inspectors in said county; incorporating the Elmira and Jackson plank road company; and to certain state roads in Columbia, Schuylkill, Clinton and Union counties," passed April tenth, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the eleventh and twelfth sections of the act, passed tenth of April, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, entitled "An Act to change the township lines of Lake and Lehman, in the county of Luzerne, and for other purposes; relative to carrying convicts to the penitentiary from Luzerne county, and the prothonotary, clerk of the court, supervisor of Lehman township, and the appointment of flour inspectors in said county; incorporating the Elmira and Jackson plank road company; and to certain state roads in Columbia, Schuylkill, Clinton and Union counties," be and the same is hereby repealed. AN ACT

To incorporate the Pittsburg and Braddock's Field plank road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That James Ross, junior, Henry Woods, William G. - zam, Thomas M. Howe, Jesse Carothers, William M. Lyon, Alexander Miller, Robert Robb, Thomas Williams, John Lyttle, David Beeler, Daniel Kuntz and George Irwine, of the county of Allegheny, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to open books, receive subscriptions, and organize a company by the name and style of "The Pittsburg and Braddock's Field plank road company," with power to construct a plank road from the city of Pittsburg, by the way of the valley of the Monongahela river, to a point on the Greensburg and Pittsburg turnpike road, at or near Turtle creek, within the said county, with all the authorities and subject to all the provisions and restrictions of the act regulating turnpike or plank road companies, passed the twenty-sixth day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, and the supplement thereto, except so much thereof relating to the imposition of tolls, as discriminates in favor of vehicles having wheels of the breadth of four inches and upwards, and such other portions of the same act as may be inconsistent herewith.

- Subject to provisions of certain act.**
- Capital stock.** SECTION 2. The capital stock of the said company shall consist of sixteen hundred shares, of twenty-five dollars each, with power, however, to the said company to enlarge the same from time to time, by new subscriptions, in case such enlargement shall be deemed necessary for the purpose of accomplishing the objects of this charter.
- Company authorized to occupy certain road.** SECTION 3. It shall be lawful for the said company to occupy with their road, the line or location of the public highway already laid out and opened from Pittsburg to Turtle creek, or so much thereof as may be adjudged to be eligible for that purpose, preserving, however, a width of not less than fifty feet throughout, in conformity with the survey and plan of road originally located under the authority of this commonwealth, between the points above indicated.
- May erect gates and collect tolls.** SECTION 4. That it shall be lawful for the said company to erect and set up a gate or gates, and to levy and collect tolls from persons traveling along, or otherwise using the said road, at the rates prescribed in the act regulating turnpike and plank road companies already referred to, and without further license, as soon as they shall have completed the first three miles of their said road leading from the city of Pittsburg.
- Repeal.** SECTION 5. That so much of the act to enable the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the city of Pittsburg, by way of Braddock's Field to Turtle creek, at or near the farm of Allen Brown, and for other purposes, as refers to the incorporation of the said last named company, be and the same is hereby repealed.
