

this act shall continue to be the common school law of said city until expressly altered or repealed, and shall neither be altered, affected, modified nor repealed, by implication nor by general words, in any general common school law that may hereafter be enacted, unless expressly named therein.

A N A C T

To authorize the commissioners of roads and highways for the township of Pleasant, Warren county, to levy additional road tax.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of roads and highways for the township of Pleasant, in the county of Warren, shall have power to lay and collect a tax for road purposes in said township, to any amount which they shall deem necessary, not exceeding in any one year, two per cent. on the valuation of property subject to road tax in said township.*
