AN ACT

To change the time of holding the courts in the counties of Tioga, Warren and Carbon.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of March next, the courts of common pleas, orphans' court and courts of quarter sessions, oyer and terminer and general jail delivery, in and for the county of Tioga, shall be held on the fourth Mondays of May, September, December and February, to continue two weeks. SECTION 2. That so much of the act of assembly approved the fifth day of April, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, as is inconsistent with this act, is hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 3. That the regular terms of the several courts of Warren county shall hereafter commence on the first Mondays of March, June, September and December in each and every year, and that so much of an act, entitled "An Act relating to judicial districts of this commonwealth," passed the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, as fixes the time of holding the courts of Warren county, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. That the courts in Carbon county shall, after the first day of April next, commence on the Mondays following the commencement of the courts in the county of Monroe.

Relative to the purchase by the United States of a certain banking house and lot in the town of Erie, Erie county, to be used as a custom house.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the consent of this legislature be and the same is hereby given for the purchase by the United States, of a certain lot or piece of ground and a banking house thereon erected, formerly occupied by the president, directors and company of the Bank of the United States, situate in the town of Erie, in the county of Erie, and that all the right, title, property and interest of this commonwealth in and to the same, are hereby ceded to and vested in the United States of America, as fully, absolutely and to the same extent as this commonwealth now holds and is entitled to the same: *Provided,* That this commonwealth may re-occupy and re-possess the same as heretofore they have occupied and possessed the same, whenever the United States shall cease to occupy the same for the purposes of the government: *And provided,* That the jurisdiction over the said premises, in civil and criminal cases, be the same as before the passing of this act.
