

OF THE SESSION OF 1850.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the auditor general and state treasurer shall each receive, in addition to the salaries now allowed said officers by law, the sum of three hundred dollars per annum, for their services respectively, as commissioners of the internal improvement fund, and as commissioners of the sinking fund; this act to take effect from and after the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.

SECTION 2. From and after the passage of this act, the salary of the surveyor general shall be fourteen hundred dollars per annum, and that of the deputy secretary of the commonwealth shall be twelve hundred dollars per annum.

A N A C T

To confer on George Waddle, of Greene township, Franklin county, all the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That George Waddle, son of Joseph Waddle, of Greene township, Franklin county, shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock, and shall be able and capable in law to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever, as fully and effectually as if he had been born in lawful wedlock.*
