AN ACT

Supplementary to an act, entitled "An Act to authorize the incorporation of a company to erect a bridge over the Juniata river at Newport, Perry county."

Act incorporating a company to make a bridge over the Juniata river at Newport, revived.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the act, entitled "An Act to authorize the incorporation of a company praying to erect a bridge over the Juniata river at Newport, Perry county," approved the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, be and the same is hereby revived, and the time to proceed to carry on the said work, be extended to three years from the passage of this act, and the time for the completion of said bridge, to five years thereafter, and John Huggins is hereby appointed a commissioner to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of James Jackman.*

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act to incorporate the Summit Branch railroad company, in Dauphin and Schuylkill counties.

Additional powers granted to the Summit Branch railroad company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the "Summit Branch railroad company," incorporated by the act of the twentieth of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be and the same is hereby invested with all the privileges, and made subject to the liabilities of the "Bear Mountain railroad company," as incorporated by the act of the thirteenth of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and its several supplements, of the fourth of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, the twenty-ninth of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and the twenty-sev-*
