## AN ACT

To authorize the sale of a certain school house in the town of Hampton.

Certain school

be sold.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Charles Blish, Moses Philips and Samuel Hinard, the present trustees of Arnold's, Deardorff's and Cronister's donative, in Reading township, in the county of Adams, adjacent to the town of Hampton, in said township, or either of them, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell at public or private sale, the school house erected and now standing on the lot of ground conveyed in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, by John B. Arnold and Rachael, his wife, Daniel Deardorff and Catharine, his wife, and Caspar Cronister, to John Miley and James Chamberlain, and their successors, in trust for the purposes of erecting a church, burying ground and school house, for the use and accommodation of the inhabitants of said town of Hampton; and on receipt of the purchase money, or the same being properly secured, to allow and permit the purchaser or purchasers thereof, to pull down or otherwise remove the said building and the materials thereof; and the said Charles Blish, Moses Philips and Samuel Hinard shall all, or any or either of them, apply the price thereof so received by them to the repairing of the fence around the said lot, and keeping the same in proper and sufficient repair, the overplus of said moneys, if any, to be held by them subject to the uses and trusts recited in the original deed for said lot.
