

Act of incorporation of the Wyoming seminary made valid.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That said act and decree of incorporation of the Wyoming seminary of the Oneida annual conference of the Methodist Episcopal church, be hereby established and made valid for all purposes and objects therein set forth, in law and in fact, with the same validity and effect as if said act and decree of incorporation had been thus made and established by an act of this general assembly.

SECTION 2. That the said act of incorporation shall be held and construed to mean that the board of trustees shall consist of twelve members, nine of the number to be elective trustees, and three of the number to be members ex-officio, as fully provided in the second article of said association.

Certain acts, &c., declared to be legal, &c.

SECTION 3. That all acts and powers heretofore performed and exercised, under and by virtue of the act and decree of incorporation aforesaid, shall be and the same are hereby declared to be legally binding upon such corporation, and valid; any defect in the said act and decree of incorporation to the contrary notwithstanding.

AN ACT

Authorizing the council of the borough of Monongahela City, Washington county, to open a street in said borough.

Mulberry alley in Monongahela City to be changed into a street, &c.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the council of the borough of Monongahela City, Washington county, be and the same are hereby authorized to make a street out of Mulberry alley, twenty-five feet wide, running from Union street to Fording street, in the plan of said borough; and should any damages be done to private property by the opening of said street, the court of the county shall, on application from the proper person or persons, appoint three disinterested persons, who shall view and assess said damages, and

make report of the same ; and the damages assessed shall, on the order of the council, be paid out of the treasury of said borough.

AN ACT

Relating to commissions of justices of the peace in the county of Bradford.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be lawful for the governor of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to issue commissions to the justices of the peace in the county of Bradford, elected on the third Friday of January last, and their successors in office, on the day on which the commissions of their respective predecessors shall expire, notwithstanding the same shall be more than twenty-five days after such election.
