AN ACT

To incorporate a company to construct a turnpike or plank road, or a road partly turnpike and partly plank, from Greensburg, in Westmoreland county, to Harvey's Five Points, on the Pittsburg and New Alexandria turnpike road, in said county; and in relation to the Bridgeport school district, erected out of parts of Westmoreland and Fayette counties.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That doctor John Morrison, H. Y. Brady, James M'Farland, John Armstrong, of Salem township, colonel D. K. Marchand, William M'Cutcheon, Samuel Kuhns, James C. Clarke, John Armstrong, junior, John Hugus, John M'Clelland, John Kuhns, Daniel Welty, of Han-nastown, and Michael Sarver, of Westmoreland county, are hereby appointed commissioners to open books and receive subscriptions, and organize a company, by the name, style and title of "The Greensburg and Harvey's Five Points turnpike or plank road company;" commencing at the borough of Greensburg, in Westmoreland county, and terminating at or near Harvey's Five Points, on the New Alexandria and Pittsburg turnpike road, in said county, with power to construct a turnpike or plank road, or a road partly plank and partly turnpike, by such route as may be agreed upon by the stockholders, or a majority of them, at a meeting called for that purpose, subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplement thereto, passed the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty nine.

SECTION 2. That the capital stock of said company shall consist of eight hundred shares, of twenty dollars per share: *Provided,* That the said company may from time to time, by a vote of the stockholders, had at a meeting called for that purpose, increase their capital stock, if it shall be deemed necessary to carry out the true intent and meaning of this act.

SECTION 3. That if the said company shall not commence the construction of their road within three years from the passage of this act, and complete the same within seven years thereafter, this act shall be void and of none effect, except so far as the same may be necessary to wind up the affairs and pay the debts of said company.

Commencement and completion of road.

SECTION 4. That Alexander Miller, Christian Tinsman and John Zundell be and they are hereby appointed to serve as school directors for the Bridgeport school district, formed out of parts of Westmoreland and Fayette counties, for the term of one year, commencing on the tenth day of March next; and the citizens of said district, are hereby authorized to hold their election for school directors in their public school house, on the first Saturday of March, in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in each succeeding year thereafter; the president of the board of directors, assisted by two citizens, shall open and hold said election, and in case of the absence of the president, the next

senior member of the board, and that the election be held between three and six o'clock in the afternoon.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Odd Fellows hall association of Monroe county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* William S. Wintermute, Silas L. Drake, John H. Melick, Silas C. Shannon, Charles U. Warnick, John Eylesberger, Theodore Schoch, Lewis Vanderbeck, Thomas W. Rhodes, Joseph J. Posten, James N. Durling, Henry M. Labar, Darias Dreher and James H. Walton, and their successors, and all persons who now are or hereafter may be associated with them, be and they are hereby created and erected into a body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The Odd Fellows hall association of Monroe county;" and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in any court of law or equity, or elsewhere, and shall be able and capable in law and in equity, to take and hold, to them and their successors, either by grant, gift, devise, lease or otherwise, any lands or real estate, for the purpose of erecting thereon a suitable building or buildings for the use of said association; and also, to take and hold for the use of the said association, any goods and chattles, sum or sums of money, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, will, devise, bequest or otherwise, from any person or persons whatsoever, capable of making the same; and the same, at their pleasure, to grant, bargain and sell for the use of said association, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do for the well-being and due management of the affairs of said association: *Provided*, That the real estate of which the said corporation shall be at any time possessed, shall not exceed the clear yearly value of two thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. That the object of the said corporation shall be to provide, erect and furnish a hall and suitable buildings, in the borough of Stroudsburg, and county of Monroe, for the accommodation of the members of Fort Penn Lodge of Odd Fellows, and other lodges that may be established in said borough, to hold their meetings in.
