AN ACT

To incorporate the Odd Fellows hall association of Monroe county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* William S. Wintermute, Silas L. Drake, John H. Melick, Silas C. Shannon, Charles U. Warnick, John Eyleneberger, Theodore Schoch, Lewis Vanderbeck, Thomas W. Rhodes, Joseph J. Posten, James N. Durling, Henry M. Labar, Darias Dreher and James H. Walton, and their successors, and all persons who now are or hereafter may be associated with them, be and they are hereby created and erected into a body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The Odd Fellows hall association of Monroe county;" and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in any court of law or equity, or elsewhere, and shall be able and capable in law and in equity, to take and hold, to them and their successors, either by grant, gift, devise, lease or otherwise, any lands or real estate, for the purpose of erecting thereon a suitable building or buildings for the use of said association; and also, to take and hold for the use of the said association, any goods and chattles, sum or sums of money, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, will, devise, bequest or otherwise, from any person or persons whatsoever, capable of making the same; and the same, at their pleasure, to grant, bargain and sell for the use of said association, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do for the well-being and due management of the affairs of said association: *Provided*, That the real estate of which the said corporation shall be at any time possessed, shall not exceed the clear yearly value of two thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. That the object of the said corporation shall be to provide, erect and furnish a hall and suitable buildings, in the borough of Stroudsburg, and county of Monroe, for the accommodation of the members of Fort Penn Lodge of Odd Fellows, and other lodges that may be established in said borough, to hold their meetings in.

SECTION 3. That it shall and may be lawful for said corporation to have a common seal, and the same at will and pleasure to change, alter Seal. and renew as they shall think proper; and shall have and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities necessary for the purposes of the corporation hereby constituted, and as herein expressed.

SECTION 4. That the government of the said Odd Fellows hall association, and the management and disposition of its affairs and property, shall be vested in a board of trustees, who shall be elected annually, at such times and in such manner as the said association shall by its by-laws provide. The officers of the association shall be a president, secretary and treasurer, who shall be elected at the annual meetings, by the stockholders, except the secretary, who shall be elected by the board of trustees at the annual meetings. All the officers shall be trustees. Board of trustees. Officers.

SECTION 5. The corporation shall have power and authority to make by-laws conformable to this charter, and not in violation of the constitution and laws of this commonwealth, or of the United States. By-laws.

SECTION 6. That the legislature hereby reserves the right to alter, revoke or annul the charter of the said Odd Fellows hall association of the borough of Stroudsburg, Monroe county, whenever, in their opinion, it may be injurious to the citizens of this commonwealth; in such a manner, however, that no injustice shall be done to the corporators thereof. AN ACT

To authorize Elizabeth Glading, and others, to convey certain real estate situate in the city of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Elizabeth Glading and William Glading, as executors of the last will and testament of John Glading, late of the city of Philadelphia, now deceased, and in their own right respectively, C. Collins Champion and Christianne, his wife, Samuel Allen and Mary B. his wife, Charles B. Glading and Sarah Elizabeth Glading be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to sell and convey in fee simple, a certain lot, situate in said city of Philadelphia, and in said testator's will, devised as "the premises on the east side of Water street above Pine street," Executors of John Glading, deceased, authorized to sell certain real estate.
