AN ACT

Relative to supervisors in the township of North Butler, Butler county.

North Butler to
elect four super-
visors.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall hereafter be lawful for the qualified voters of North Butler township, in the county of Butler, annually, to elect four supervisors of roads for said township, at the time and place now fixed by law for the election of supervisors.*

Hopewell town-
ship, York coun-
ty, to elect three
supervisors.

SECTION 2. The qualified voters of Hopewell township, York county, shall at their next spring election, and annually thereafter, elect three supervisors of public highways for said township.

AN ACT

Relative to election districts.

Part of Wilming-
ton township
erected into a
separate election
district.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the portion of the former township of Wilmington, which lies north of the division line between the counties of Mercer and Lawrence, and which is now the township of Wilmington, in the county of Mercer, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their township and general elections at the house of Daniel Paup, in said township.*

Officers of elec-
tion.

SECTION 2. That Daniel Paup is hereby appointed judge, and Kennedy M'Farland and William M. Cowden are hereby appointed inspectors, whose duty it shall be to open, hold and conduct, on the third Friday of March next, an election for the usual township officers, and

also, for two inspectors and one judge of elections ; and it shall also be the duty of the said Daniel Paup, to give notice of said election in the same manner, form and time as constables are directed by law to give of township elections ; and the election so held, shall be opened, conducted, and the returns thereof made, according to the provisions of the acts of assembly regulating township elections.

SECTION 3. That the eighteenth section of an act, entitled " An Act regulating election districts," passed the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, be and the same is hereby repealed ; and that the qualified voters of that part of North Manheim township, Schuylkill county, who, prior to the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, voted at the public house of Philip Boyer, in the borough of Schuylkill Haven, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the public house known as the Half-Way house, now occupied by Susannah Mayer, in said township.

North Manheim township, place of holding elections in.

SECTION 4. That the township of Springfield, in the county of Fayette, shall constitute a separate election district, and the citizens thereof shall hold their township and general elections at the school house in the town of Springfield, in said township ; and that David Keasler is hereby appointed judge, and William Cummings and P. A. Sherbondy inspectors of the township election in said township, in March eighteen hundred and fifty.

Springfield township, Fayette county, erected into a separate election district.

SECTION 5. That hereafter, the qualified voters of Crawford township, in Clinton county, shall hold their general and township elections at the house of Rudolph Miller, in said township.

Crawford township, Clinton county, place of holding elections in, changed.

SECTION 6. That the qualified voters of the township of Moreland, in the county of Lycoming, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house now owned by Thomas Smith, and occupied by William Holdren, in the township of Moreland, in said county.

Moreland township, Lycoming county.

SECTION 7. That the township of Springfield, in Bucks county, shall be divided into four road districts, as follows, to wit : That part of said township lying west of the road leading from Leithville to Quakertown, to compose the western district ; that part between the western district and the Bethlehem road, to compose the middle district ; that part north of the road leading from Bethlehem road to the Durham road, by way of Kressnan's mill and Bursontown, to compose the northern district ; and that part south of the northern district, to compose the southern district ; and that hereafter it shall be lawful for the qualified voters of said township, to elect annually, at their usual places and time of electing township officers, four qualified citizens for supervisors of public roads, one of whom shall be a resident of each of the aforesaid districts, to make and repair the public roads in the districts in which they shall severally reside ; and who shall, in all other respects, be subject to the same rules and regulations by which supervisors are now by law regulated.

Springfield township, Bucks county, divided into four road districts.

SECTION 8. That the borough of Uniontown, Fayette county, be and the same is hereby divided into two wards, commencing at the north end of Bank alley ; thence running southward along the middle of said alley, to the middle of Redstone street ; thence following the middle of said street, to the southern boundary of said borough ; that portion of said borough east of said line, to be styled the East ward ; and that portion west of said line, to be styled the West ward ; and the place of holding the election for both wards, shall be in the court house, in said borough ; each ward to have its separate room and window for holding the same ; and that the two justices of the peace to which the said borough is entitled, shall be hereafter elected by the legal voters of each ward separately, and each ward to be entitled to one justice of the peace, who shall be a resident of the ward in which he is elected ; and the

constable of said borough shall be elected by a joint vote of the two wards.

Officers for the

SECTION 9. That the judge and inspectors of the elections, elected in the year one thousand eight hundred forty-nine, for Union borough, shall be the judge and inspectors to hold the ensuing election, in the said West ward, for judge and inspectors, and other township officers; and Gabriel Getzendaner be and is hereby appointed judge, and William C. Stephens and John Canon inspectors, to hold the election in the East ward; and the qualified voters of each ward are hereby authorized to meet at their respective places of holding the elections, at the usual time, and elect inspectors and judges for the elections of said wards: *Provided*, That nothing herein contained shall affect the present mode of conducting the charter elections of said borough.

SECTION 10. That the township of Sandy Lake, in the county of Mercer, be and the same hereby is erected into a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of doctor J. P. Vath, in said township; and Daniel Stickel is hereby appointed judge, and Thomas Brown and Hugh Baird are hereby appointed inspectors, or such of them as shall be necessary under the election laws of this commonwealth, to act in conjunction with such other person or persons as may have been duly elected judge or inspector of elections, by the qualified electors of Sandy Lake township, in said county, in March last, and who may, on the third Friday of March next, reside within said township as at present established, to open, hold and conduct, on the third Friday of March next, the township elections in said township, for the election of the usual township officers, and also, for one judge and two inspectors of elections; and it shall be the duty of the said Daniel Stickel, or such other person as may be judge, as aforesaid, to give notice of the said elections in the same manner, time, and with the same legal effect, as constables are required by law to give of township elections.

SECTION 11. That the township of Worth, in the county of Mercer, be and the same hereby is erected into a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general and township elections at the brick house of John Gadsby, in said township; and Johnson Graham is hereby appointed judge, and Aaron Carmichael and James Miller are hereby appointed inspectors, or such of them as shall be necessary under the election laws of this commonwealth, to act in conjunction with such other person or persons as may have been duly elected judge or inspector of elections, by the qualified electors of Sandy Lake township, in said county, in March last, and who may, on the third Friday of March next, reside in said township of Worth, whose duty it shall be to hold and conduct the township elections in the said township, on the third Friday in March next; and it shall also be the duty of such judge, to give the notices of the said election, in the same manner, and with the same legal effect, as constables are required by law to do of township elections.

SECTION 12. That the qualified voters of the township of East Lackawannock, in the county of Mercer, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at school house number two, in said township.

Mill Creek township,

SECTION 13. That the township of Mill Creek, in the county of Mercer, be and the same hereby is erected into a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the Wry school house, in said township; and Abraham K. Price is hereby appointed judge, and Gorden Vorhies and Joseph Jackson are hereby appointed inspectors, or such of them as shall be necessary under the election laws of this commonwealth, to act

in conjunction with such other person or persons as may have been duly elected judge or inspector of elections, by the qualified electors of French Creek township, in said county, in March last, and who may, on the third Friday of March next, reside in said township of Mill Creek, whose duty it shall be to open, hold and conduct, on the third Friday of March next, the usual township elections, in the said township of Mill Creek; and it shall further be the duty of such judge, to give the notices of the said township elections required by law to be given by the constable, and with the like force and virtue, and in the same manner.

SECTION 14. That the township of French Creek, in the county of Mercer, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of John Moore, in said township; and Joseph Smith is hereby appointed judge, and Crookson Long and John Moore are hereby appointed inspectors, or such of them as shall be necessary under the election laws of this commonwealth, to act in conjunction with such other person or persons as may have been duly elected judge or inspector of elections, by the qualified electors of French Creek township, in said county, in March last, and who may, on the third Friday of March next, reside in said township, to hold and conduct the township elections in said township, for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty; and it shall be the duty of such judge, to give the notices of the said township elections, in the same manner and with the same effect as constables are by law required to give of township elections.

French Creek township, Mercer county, erected into a separate election district.

SECTION 15. That from and after the passage of this act, the qualified voters of the township of Penn Forest, in the county of Carbon, shall hold their general and township elections at the house of Enos Koch, in said township.

SECTION 16. That the borough of Mauch Chunk, in the county of Carbon, is hereby erected into a separate election district, and that the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general and borough elections at the house of John Lentz, in said borough.

SECTION 17. That from and after the passage of this act, the qualified voters of the township of Mauch Chunk, in the county of Carbon, shall hold their general and township elections at the house of John Lentz, in said township.

SECTION 18. That the qualified voters of Herrick township, in the county of Bradford, shall hereafter hold their general, special and township elections at the house now occupied by James and Henry Durand's, in said township.

Herrick township, Bradford county, place of holding elections in.

SECTION 19. That the qualified electors of Young township, in Indiana county, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at school house number five, in said township.

Young township, Indiana county.

SECTION 20. That hereafter the qualified electors of the township of Cornplanter, Venango county, shall hold their general and township elections at the house now occupied by James and Henry Turner, in said township; and that hereafter the qualified electors of Cornplanter township shall hold their spring election on the second Friday of February, to elect their township officers, instead of the day now appointed by law.

SECTION 21. That the qualified voters of South-West township, in Wayne county, are hereby authorized to hold their township and general elections at the house of Warner Perry, in the village of Enterprise.

SECTION 22. That hereafter the qualified electors of Bagg township, in Centre county, shall hold their spring and general elections in the brick school house near Millsburg, in said township.

SECTION 23. That hereafter the qualified electors of Patton township, in Centre county, shall hold their spring and general elections at the public house of Peter Murray, in said township.

SECTION 24. That the township of Pocopson, in the county of Chester, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified electors thereof shall hold their general and township elections at the house of Holton C. Yarnall, in Locust Grove, in said township.

Wayne town-

SECTION 25. That the qualified electors of Wayne township, Armstrong county, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of George Ellenberger, in said township.

Watts township,
Perry county,

district.

SECTION 26. That the new township of Watts, in the county of Perry, is hereby erected into a separate election district, and that the qualified voters of said township shall hold their general and township elections at the school house near the Lutheran church, in said township; and that Thomas J. Linton is hereby appointed judge, and Alexander M'Alister and Benjamin Livingston, inspectors, whose duty it shall be to serve as election officers, until others shall be duly elected; and that the first spring or township election for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, shall be held on the fifth Friday of March, and in all other respects shall be governed by the general election laws of this commonwealth.

SECTION 27. That from and after the passage of this act, the borough of New Buffalo, in the county of Perry, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate general election district, and the qualified voters of said borough shall hold their general election at the school house in said borough: *Provided*, That the election for inspectors and judge of elections, shall be held on the fifth Friday of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and that said election shall be held by the same persons who are legally authorized to hold the election of school directors.

SECTION 28. The borough of White Haven, in Luzerne county, shall form a separate election district, and the place of holding the general and borough elections shall be at the house now occupied by Arthur Smith, in said borough, and that David Dean and Abraham Ripple be the inspectors, and Arthur Smith the judge, to hold the spring election next ensuing the passage of this act.

SECTION 29. That the qualified voters of Versailles township, in the county of Allegheny, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the brick school house, situated in the vicinity of the house of William A. Shaw, in said township.

SECTION 30. That hereafter the citizens of Derry township, Columbia county, shall hold their general and township elections at the public house owned by Alexander B. Cummings, and lately occupied by Alexander Cummings, in the town of Washingtonville, in said township.

SECTION 31. That hereafter the qualified voters of Eulalia township, in the county of Potter, shall hold their general election at the house of S. S. Roberts, in the borough of Coudersport, in said township.

Reading town-

SECTION 32. That the qualified voters of the township of Reading, in the county of Adams, shall hold their general elections at the public house now occupied by Isaac Yount, in the town of Hampton, in said township.

SECTION 33. That hereafter the qualified electors of Pymatuning township, in the county of Mercer, (except those residing in the bor-

ough of Clarksville,) shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the school house known as the Campbell school house, in said township.

SECTION 34. That hereafter the qualified electors of the township of Fallowfield town-
Fallowfield, in the county of Washington, shall hold their township ship, Washing-
and general elections at the house now occupied by Peter Snyder, in ton county.

AN ACT

Relative to the Lancaster county prison.

WHEREAS, The commissioners of Lancaster county are now erect- Preamble.
ing a new county prison, for the government and regulation of which,
legislative enactment is required ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
tives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly
met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That
the said new prison when completed, shall be known and called by the Name.
name of "The Lancaster county prison," and shall be managed by a
board of inspectors, consisting of six discreet taxable citizens residing
in said county, who shall be elected by the electors of the county of
Lancaster, as follows : the qualified electors of the county of Lancas-
ter aforesaid, shall at the general election next ensuing the passing of
this act, and in the manner prescribed by law for the election of mem-
bers of the house of representatives of this commonwealth, elect six
discreet taxable citizens of the said county, to be inspectors of said
prison ; and the return judges of the election of the said county of Lan-
caster, shall immediately on receiving the returns from the election dis-
tricts and casting up the number of votes therein, or within three days
thereafter, certify the names of the inspectors so elected to the pro-
thonotary of the said county, who shall file the said certificate in his
office, and forthwith give notice in writing, to the said inspectors of
their election ; and the said inspectors shall meet at the commissioners'
office of the said county, on the first Monday in November next ensu-
ing their election, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, and divide them-
selves by lot into three classes, the places of the first to be vacated at
the expiration of one year from the day of their election, of the second
at the expiration of two years from the day of their election, and the
