A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act regulating election districts, and for other purposes," approved the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sixty-seventh section of the act to which this is a supplement, shall not be so construed so as to interfere, or in any way affect the title to, or boundary lines of any lands that may have been located near the line mentioned in said section, or bounded on the old county line between Indiana and Cambria counties, previous to the passage of the act to which this is a supplement. Boundary lines to certain lands not to be affected by act of 14th April, 1850.

SECTION 2. That section twenty-second of an act of assembly passed the sixteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, entitled "An Act regulating election districts," be and the same is hereby repealed. Act erecting Mississinewa township, Westmoreland county, repealed.

AN ACT

In relation to certain school districts; and to repeal the twentieth section of an act relative to certain school districts in the counties of Jefferson, Indiana, Cambria, Westmoreland, &c., passed the ninth of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the township of Aleppo, in the county of Greene, be and the same is hereby erected into sub-school districts, and each sub-school district aforesaid, to be laid off three miles square, or as near as may be done conveniently, and the school houses in each, to be placed as near the districts, &c. Aleppo township, Greene county, erected into sub-school districts, &c.

centre of their respective districts, as may be found advantageous to the inhabitants thereof, as the nature of the location will admit; and that the present directors, or the directors that may be hereafter elected for the said township, are hereby empowered to proceed forthwith to district said township of Alleppo, and locate the public school houses therein.

Prospect borough, Butler county, erected into a separate school district.

SECTION 2. That the borough of Prospect, in the county of Butler, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate school district, and as such shall have power to elect all such officers, and shall have all the rights and privileges granted to other school districts; and the elections thereof shall be held in the school house in said borough, and on the day and in the manner provided by law, for holding the elections in the adjoining districts; and the qualified citizens of said borough, shall at their first election, elect six school directors for said district, two to serve for one year, two to serve for two years, and two to serve for three years; and their successors shall hereafter be elected in the manner provided by law in other school districts.

Mode of electing school directors in Moyamensing, Philadelphia county, changed.

SECTION 3. That so much of the second section of an act to provide for the education of children at public expense within the city and county of Philadelphia, passed March third, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, as requires the board of commissioners of the district of Moyamensing, in the county of Philadelphia, to elect by ballot, school directors, be and the same is hereby repealed; and hereafter the school directors, and all other officers elected by said board of commissioners, shall be elected *vis à voce*.

Mount Pleasant sub-school district, Lower Saucon township, Northampton county, relative to.

SECTION 4. That the twentieth section of the act, approved on the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, entitled "An Act relative to certain school districts in Jefferson, Indiana, Cambria, Westmoreland, Blair, Carbon, Schuylkill, Bedford, Chester, Delaware, Washington and Northampton counties; relative to supplying the several schools of the commonwealth with state maps; and providing for a public high school, and for the education of colored children in the city of Pittsburg," be and the same is hereby repealed; and the persons therein named shall be re-annexed to the sub-school district to which they belonged before the passage of that act.

Treasurer of East Calm school district, Chester county, required to collect outstanding tax, &c.

SECTION 5. That the treasurer of the school district of East Calm, in the county of Chester, be and he is hereby required to collect all the outstanding school tax now remaining unpaid in said district, in the same manner as collectors of county rates and levies are by law authorized and directed.
