A N A C T

To correct clerical errors in the appropriation act of tenth April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, relative to the claims of R. Smith, Sarah and Rhoda Barber, and Hannaniah Gant, and to provide for the payment of the claims of John N. Graft and Robert W. Smith.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That where the name of H. Smith occurs, in the twenty-second division of the first section of the appropriation act of the tenth of April last, it shall be read R. Smith, so that under said act the money therein mentioned shall be payable to R. Smith, or his order.

SECTION 2. That the state treasurer be ordered and directed to pay to John N. Graft, the sum of seven dollars twelve cents, being the amount of his pay and mileage as a witness in the investigation of the charges against honorable William N. Irvine, president judge of the nineteenth judicial district of Pennsylvania.

SECTION 3. That so much of the twenty-second division of the act to provide for the ordinary expenses of the government, the repair of the canals and railroads of the commonwealth, and the payment of other claims due by the same, passed the tenth day of April, eighteen hundred and forty-nine, as appropriates "to Rhoda Barber for damages awarded by the canal commissioners, three hundred and twenty-five dollars," shall be construed to authorize the payment of the money so appropriated to Sarah and Rhoda Barber, the real parties to whom the said damages were awarded by the canal commissioners.

SECTION 4. That the state treasurer is hereby directed to pay to Robert W. Smith, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of thirteen dollars twenty-four cents in full, for his compensation for mileage and attendance as a witness before the committee of the house of representatives, in the investigation of the charges against honorable William N. Irvine, president judge of the nineteenth judicial district of Pennsylvania.

SECTION 5. That the name of Hannaniah Grant, in the twenty-second division of the first section of the act to provide for the ordinary appropriation bill of expenses of the government, &c., passed tenth April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, be corrected so as to read Hannaniah Gant.

AN ACT

Regulating certain election districts.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified electors in Eldred township, Jefferson county, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at the house of Andrew Shall, in said township.

SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the township of Antalawny, in the county of Berks, shall be and constitute a separate election district; and the qualified voters of said township shall hold their general and township elections at the house of Reuben E. Addams in said township, and Christian Fox is hereby appointed judge, and Jeremiah Mengle and James Bell inspectors, to hold the first township election on the third Friday in March next, and then and thenceforth said officers, and all other necessary township officers, to be elected as now provided by law.

SECTION 3. The qualified electors of the township of Farmington, in the county of Clarion, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the school house in Tylersburg, in said township.

SECTION 4. That the qualified voters of the township of South-West, in the county of Warren, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at the house of Warner Perry, in the village of Enterprise.

SECTION 5. That the township of Madison, in Luzerne county, is hereby erected into an election district, and the place of holding the township and general elections shall be at the white school house, in said township.

SECTION 6. That hereafter the place of holding the township and general elections in Salem township, Luzerne county, shall be at the house of Wallace Sybert, at Beach Haven, in said township.
