AN ACT

Regulating certain election districts.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Eldred township, Jefferson county, the qualified electors in Eldred township, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at the house of Andrew Shall, in said township.

SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the township of Antalawny, in the county of Berks, shall be and constitute a separate election district; and the qualified voters of said township shall hold their general and township elections at the house of Reuben E. Addams in said township, and Christian Fox is hereby appointed judge, and Jeremiah Mengle and James Bell inspectors, to hold the first township election on the third Friday in March next, and then and thenceforth said officers, and all other necessary township officers, to be elected as now provided by law. Antalawny township, Berks county, erected into a separate election district.

SECTION 3. The qualified electors of the township of Farmington, in the county of Clarion, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the school house in Tylersburg, in said township. Farmington township, Clarion county.

SECTION 4. That the qualified voters of the township of South-West, in the county of Warren, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at the house of Warner Perry, in the village of Enterprise. South-West township, Warren county.

SECTION 5. That the township of Madison, in Luzerne county, is hereby erected into an election district, and the place of holding the township and general elections shall be at the white school house, in said township. Madison township, Luzerne county.

SECTION 6. That hereafter the place of holding the township and general elections in Salem township, Luzerne county, shall be at the house of Wallace Sybert, at Beach Haven, in said township. Salem township, Luzerne county.

Ramsom township, Luzerne county.

SECTION 7. That the township of Ramsom, in Luzerne county, be and it is hereby erected into an election district, and the place of holding the township and general elections shall be at the school house near the house of John Dorshirmer, in said township.

Union township, Jefferson county.

SECTION 8. The qualified electors in Union township, Jefferson county, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at the house of Robert Barr, junior, in said township, and the time of holding the township elections shall hereafter be on the fourth Monday in February, in each year.

Clover election district, Jefferson county.

SECTION 9. That the qualified electors of Clover election district, in Jefferson county, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at the public school house in Troy, in said district.

Upper Allen township, Cumberland county.
Lower Allen township.

SECTION 10. That all elections hereafter to be held in Upper Allen township, in the county of Cumberland, shall be held at the public house of David Sheffer, in Shepherdstown, in said township; and that all elections hereafter to be held for Lower Allen township, in the said county of Cumberland, shall be held at Jonas Hunchbarger's wagon-maker shop, on State hill, in said township, and any laws inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed; and that the judge and inspectors elected in March last, for the Shepherdstown box, now Upper Allen township, shall be and are empowered hereby to hold the next spring election; and that the judge and inspector elected at Milltown box last March, now Lower Allen township, shall be and are empowered hereby to hold the next spring election at Slate hill, in Jonas Hunchbarger's wagon-maker shop.

Windham township, Wyoming county.

SECTION 11. That the qualified voters of the township of Windham, in the county of Wyoming, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Ambrose Garey, now occupied by Ziba Lott, in said township.

Huntingdon township, Luzerne county.

SECTION 12. That the place of holding the township and general elections in the township of Huntingdon, in Luzerne county, shall, after the ensuing March election, be held at the house of Nathan D. Stiles, in said township.

Fourth ward, Kensington, Philadelphia county.

SECTION 13. That the qualified voters of the Fourth ward, Kensington, in the county of Philadelphia, shall hereafter hold their ward elections at the house of John Brewers, in said ward.

Dundaff borough, Susquehanna county, erected into a separate election district.

SECTION 14. That from and after the passage of this act, the borough of Dundaff, in the county of Susquehanna, shall be and constitute a separate election district; and the qualified voters of said borough shall hold their general and borough elections at the Dundaff hotel, in said borough, and George Cone is hereby appointed judge, and James Chambers, S. G. Weaver inspectors, to hold the first general election, and thenceforth all officers to be elected as now provided by law.

Beaver township, Jefferson county, place of holding elections.

SECTION 15. That beginning at a post in the county of Jefferson, on the Clarion county line, one and one-half miles south of the north-west corner of North Porter township; thence east to Perry township line; thence north three and one-half miles to a post; thence west to the Clarion county line; thence south to the place of beginning; all within the boundary described, be and the same is hereby erected a new township, to be called Beaver; and that John M'Amrich, John Heath and Robert R. Means are hereby appointed commissioners to run and mark the lines of said township, the expenses of which shall be paid out of the treasury of Jefferson county.

Beaver township, place of holding elections.

SECTION 16. The qualified electors of Beaver township, Jefferson county, shall hold their township and general elections at the house of D. D. Wonderleih, in Heathville, said district, and that the time of holding the township elections shall be the first Monday in February,

in each year, and that D. D. Wonderleih act as judge, John H. Hilderbrand and Charles Jacox as inspectors, to hold the township elections for one thousand eight hundred and fifty, which shall be holden on the first Monday in June.

SECTION 17. That the name of Isaac Yount, in the thirty-second section of the act, entitled "An Act relative to election districts," approved the nineteenth, of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, shall read Israel Yount, the same having been inserted in said act as and by the name of Isaac Yount, by a clerical error; and the said section of said act, shall be held and taken as if the name of Israel Yount had been therein originally inserted.

AN ACT

Authorizing the representatives of Peter Miller, deceased, to pay certain moneys to the German Reformed and Lutheran congregations of Easton.

WHEREAS, Peter Miller, late of the borough of Easton, deceased, bequeathed to the Female benevolent societies connected respectively with the German Reformed congregation of Easton, and with the German Evangelical Lutheran congregation of Easton, the interest of ten thousand dollars, to be paid half yearly out of the proceeds of his real and personal estate:

Preamble.

And whereas, The heirs and others now interested in the said estate, are desirous to hold the same freed and discharged from all claims for or by reason of the said bequest; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the executors and heirs of the said Peter Miller, deceased, be and they are hereby authorized to pay the said principal sum of ten thousand dollars, to wit: five thousand dollars to the said the German Reformed congregation of Easton, and five thousand dollars to the said the German Evangelical Lutheran congregation of Easton, who are hereby severally authorized and empowered to receive and hold the same, in trust for the use of their respective benevolent societies, the annual interest thereof, to be appropriated in such manner as may from time to time be directed by the said benevolent societies respectively; and the receipts, acquittances or releases executed by the said congregations

Executors and heirs of Peter Miller, deceased, authorized to pay certain moneys.
