AN ACT

Authorizing the representatives of Peter Miller, deceased, to pay certain moneys to the German Reformed and Lutheran congregations of Easton.

WHEREAS, Peter Miller, late of the borough of Easton, deceased, bequeathed to the Female benevolent societies connected respectively with the German Reformed congregation of Easton, and with the German Evangelical Lutheran congregation of Easton, the interest of ten thousand dollars, to be paid half yearly out of the proceeds of his real and personal estate:

And whereas, The heirs and others now interested in the said estate, are desirous to hold the same freed and discharged from all claims for or by reason of the said bequest; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the executors and heirs of the said Peter Miller, deceased, be and they are hereby authorized to pay the said principal sum of ten thousand dollars, to wit: five thousand dollars to the said the German Reformed congregation of Easton, and five thousand dollars to the said the German Evangelical Lutheran congregation of Easton, who are hereby severally authorized and empowered to receive and hold the same, in trust for the use of their respective benevolent societies, the annual interest thereof, to be appropriated in such manner as may from time to time be directed by the said benevolent societies respectively; and the receipts, acquittances or releases executed by the said congregations

Executors and heirs of Peter Miller, deceased, authorized to pay certain moneys.

respectively, and delivered to the said executors or heirs, upon payment of the said moneys, shall fully exonerate and discharge the residuary estate of the said Peter Miller, deceased, from all incumbrance or lien to which it might otherwise be held, subject by reason of the said hereinbefore recited bequest.

SECTION 2. That Samuel Wilhelm, executor and trustee, named in the last will and testament of the said Peter Miller, deceased, be and he hereby is authorized and empowered to assign and transfer stocks, or other securities belonging to the estate of the said deceased, to the said congregations respectively, in whole or in part of the said sums, as may be agreed upon, and to assign and transfer the residue of such stocks or securities, to the legal representatives of the said deceased, divested of the further trust of the said will.

AN ACT

Relative to the appraisement of mercantile taxes in the county of Berks.

Relative to the duties of appraiser of mercantile taxes in Berks county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all the duties enjoined on the appraiser of mercantile taxes in the county of Berks, that are devolved on him by the several provisions of the acts of assembly heretofore passed, shall be executed and performed by him, on or before the first day of June, in this and every succeeding year, and that the day or days of appeal shall be not later than the fifteenth day of July thereafter.

Repeal of certain act relative to county rates and levies in Clearfield county.

SECTION 2. That so much of the fourth section of a further supplement to an act, entitled "An Act relating to county rates and levies," passed the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, passed fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, as relates to Clearfield county, be and the same is hereby repealed.
