AN ACT

Relative to the distribution of an unexpended balance of money remaining in the treasury of York county, among the several school districts of said county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the true intent and meaning of the fifteenth section of an act of assembly, approved the ninth day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, entitled "An Act relative to certain school districts in Jefferson, Indiana, Cambria, Westmoreland, Blair, Carbon, Schuylkill, Bedford, Chester, Delaware, Washington and Northampton counties; relative to supplying the several schools of the commonwealth with the state maps; and providing for a public school, and for the education of colored children in the city of Pittsburg," is hereby declared to be, that the treasurer of York county shall pay to the treasurer of the Manchester school district, in said county, for the use and support of the schools therein, such share or proportion of the money remaining in said county treasury, under and by virtue of the provisions of the act of April first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, entitled "An Act to establish a general system of education by common schools," as said Manchester district shall be entitled to receive; under and by virtue of the provisions of the thirty-seventh section of the act of April seventh, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, entitled "An Act for the regulation and continuance of a system of education by common schools," and no more.
