AN ACT

Relative to the estate of the late James M'Alpin.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That before the executors and trustees of the estate of James M'Alpin, deceased, shall have power to make a valid and effectual sale, or lease of real estate, in accordance with the provisions of the fourth section of the act of assembly, entitled "An Act to confer on Clarissa Augusta Hess, of Columbia county, the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock; relative to real estate of the German Lutheran church, of James M'Alpin, Churchill Houston; and in reference to the Bank of Kentucky," approved April twentieth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, the propriety of said sale or lease shall have been adjudged by the court of common pleas of the city and county of Philadelphia, upon the petition of said executors and trustees, and notice to the parties interested.*

AN ACT

To erect Hartford, in Crawford county, into a borough.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Hartstown, in the county of Crawford, shall be and the same is hereby erected into a borough, which shall be called the borough of "Hartford," bounded and limited as follows: beginning at the north-west corner on line of John Kinsman, where Joseph Patten's land intersects said line; thence east to the embankment; thence by the embankment*
