

officers provided for by this law, shall be the same as are required in the election of similar officers in the different townships in said county.

Separate election district.

SECTION 9. The said borough shall form a separate election district, and the qualified voters therein shall hereafter hold their general and borough elections at the school house in said borough.

Election.

SECTION 10. The borough elections in said borough, shall be held on the third Friday in March of every year, between the hours of nine o'clock, A. M., and six o'clock, P. M., of said day.

Moneys due to be divided ratably.

SECTION 11. Any indebtedness by West Fallowfield township, for the making and repairing of roads or bridges, and for the support of paupers, and by West Fallowfield school district, shall be paid ratably by the proper authorities of the said township and district, and the borough of Hartford, and any money due or owing to the said township or district, shall be divided ratably between the said township and district and the borough of Hartford.

Taxes.

SECTION 12. It shall be lawful for the town council of said borough, to assess and collect a tax on all single freemen and inmates resident in said borough, to be rated according to the provisions of the act to raise and collect county rates and levies; and the said town council shall further have the power and authority to assess and collect on each and every dog owned in said borough, a tax in amount not exceeding one dollar, and on every bitch, a tax in amount not exceeding three dollars, as they may deem expedient and proper for the use of said corporation.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Newtown and Rockville turnpike or plank road company.

Commissioners.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* doctor Phineas Jenks, Mahlon K. Taylor, Joseph Morrison, doctor David Hutchinson, David Cornell, Daniel Y. Harman, Charles Beans, John Webster, Edward Leedom, Lewis Buckman, George W. Cunningham, Cornelius Slack, Jacob Buckman, Amos Smith, Joshua Woolston, Stacey Brown, Henry Wynkoop, Samuel T. Hilborn, Adrain Cornell, junior, David Feaster, Joseph Camm, Robert Trego, Robert Longshore, M. H. Jenks, Edward H. Worstall, S. M. Hough

and John Barnsley of Bucks county, or any five of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions, and organize a company by the name, style and title of the *Style*. "Newtown and Rocksville turnpike or plank road company," to locate *Location*. and construct a turnpike or plank road on the bed of the present public road, known as the New Buck road, or otherwise, as the company may direct, leading from the borough of Newtown to the Buck tavern, in Southampton township, Bucks county, subject to all the provisions *Subject to provisions of certain act*. and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, so far as they are not inconsistent with this and the following sections.

SECTION 2. The capital stock of the said company shall consist of five hundred shares, at twenty-five dollars per share: *Provided*, The said company may from time to time, at a meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose, increase their capital stock to such an amount as in their opinion may be required to complete the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this act. *Capital stock.*

SECTION 3. The said company may commence the construction of their road at any intermediate point: *Provided*, Such commencement shall be made within five years after the passage of this act; and should the said company fail to complete their road within ten years after the same shall have been commenced, then this act shall be null and void, except so far as shall become necessary to settle the affairs of the company. *Commencement and completion of road.*

AN ACT

To extend the limits of the borough of Saltsburg.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the corporate limits of the borough of Saltsburg, in the county of Indiana, be and the same are hereby extended and enlarged so that they will hereafter include within them twelve certain lots of ground, which were laid out by Samuel Keely, and numbered respectively from number one hundred and eighty-seven to number one hundred and ninety-eight in-
