

and John Barnsley of Bucks county, or any five of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions, and organize a company by the name, style and title of the *Style*. "Newtown and Rocksville turnpike or plank road company," to locate *Location*. and construct a turnpike or plank road on the bed of the present public road, known as the New Buck road, or otherwise, as the company may direct, leading from the borough of Newtown to the Buck tavern, in Southampton township, Bucks county, subject to all the provisions *Subject to provisions of certain act*. and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, so far as they are not inconsistent with this and the following sections.

SECTION 2. The capital stock of the said company shall consist of five hundred shares, at twenty-five dollars per share: *Provided*, The said company may from time to time, at a meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose, increase their capital stock to such an amount as in their opinion may be required to complete the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this act. *Capital stock.*

SECTION 3. The said company may commence the construction of their road at any intermediate point: *Provided*, Such commencement shall be made within five years after the passage of this act; and should the said company fail to complete their road within ten years after the same shall have been commenced, then this act shall be null and void, except so far as shall become necessary to settle the affairs of the company. *Commencement and completion of road.*

AN ACT

To extend the limits of the borough of Saltsburg.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the corporate limits of the borough of Saltsburg, in the county of Indiana, be and the same are hereby extended and enlarged so that they will hereafter include within them twelve certain lots of ground, which were laid out by Samuel Keely, and numbered respectively from number one hundred and eighty-seven to number one hundred and ninety-eight in-

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clusive, and known as "Keely's addition to the town of Saltsburg;" and the said lots shall hereafter be for all purposes considered as within said borough.

A N A C T

Extending certain road laws in Susquehanna, Wayne and Wyoming counties; and in relation to paupers in Northampton, Schuylkill and Somerset counties.

Provisions of certain act extended to Auburn and Liberty townships, Susquehanna county, and Washington township, &c.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth sections of the act, entitled "An Act to alter the road laws in the township of Lenox, in the county of Susquehanna, and for other purposes," passed the third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, be and the same is hereby extended to the townships of Auburn and Liberty, in the county of Susquehanna, to the township of Washington, in the county of Wyoming, and to the township of Canaan, in the county of Wayne.

Relative to paupers in Northampton, &c.

SECTION 2. That from and after the date hereof, all orders for the relief or support of paupers in the counties of Northampton, Schuylkill and Somerset, which shall be signed only by one justice of the peace of said counties, shall be deemed and taken to be as valid as if the same were signed by two justices of the peace.
