## AN ACT

To incorporate the Cawenesque plank road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* James Ford, Clarke Slosson, John Ryon, E. D. Wells, John W. Ryon, W. W. Ballard, Hunt Pumroy, Joel Parkhurst, Philip Taylor, James Knox, Eddy Howland, Pardon Damon and Joseph Weaver, or any five of them, be and the same are hereby appointed commissioners to open the books, receive subscriptions, and organize a company by the name, style and title of "The Cawenesque plank road company," to locate and construct a plank road from Knoxville to Lawrenceville, in the county of Tioga, subject to the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplement thereto, as far as they are not inconsistent with this and the following sections.

SECTION 2. The capital stock of said company shall consist of two thousand shares, of twenty-five dollars per share: *Provided*, Said company may from time to time, at a meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose, increase the capital stock to such an amount as in their opinion may be required to complete the same, according to the true intent and meaning of this act.

SECTION 3. That if the said company shall not commence the construction of said road within three years from the passage of this act, and complete the same within seven years thereafter, this act shall be null and void, except so far as it may be necessary to wind up the affairs of said company, and pay the debts of the same.
