AN ACT

Relative to the courts in Blair county.

Certain writs
served by the
sheriff of Blair
county, made
valid.

July term, Blair
county, changed.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* all writs served by the sheriff of Blair county, returnable to July term, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, be and the same are hereby rendered as valid and binding to all intents and purposes, as though the regular return day of said term had not been changed from the fourth to the third Mondays of July, in each year, subsequent to the commencement of said term, and as though all writs in said county had been made returnable on the third Monday of July, in said year.

SECTION 2. That the time of holding the July term of the several courts in the said county of Blair, be and the same is hereby changed from the third Monday in July to the third Monday in June; and that hereafter, the several courts of said county, at each term thereof, shall continue for two weeks if necessary.

Relating to the common schools in the borough of Norristown, in the county of Montgomery.

School districts in

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* so much of the act of assembly passed April seventh, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, entitled "An Act for the regulation and continuance of a system of education by common schools," which directs that each ward shall constitute and be a school district, shall not be construed to apply to the borough of Norristown, but the said bor-
