A SUPPLEMENT

To an act incorporating the Washington hall association of the borough and county of York.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* if any stockholder of the Washington hall association, of the borough and county aforesaid, or his or her assignee, shall neglect or refuse to pay any proportion or instalment of the capital stock of said association, for which he or she may have subscribed, or become the owner, for a longer period than ninety days after the same has become due, such share or shares of said capital stock, shall be forfeited to the said association, with all the instalments that may have been paid thereon; and the trustees of said association may sell the share or shares so forfeited, to any person or persons willing to purchase the same, or at their option, may bring suit before any justice of the peace of the proper county for recovery of the unpaid instalment, with interest from the time the same became due: *Provided, That* no share of stock shall be forfeited as aforesaid, until twenty days' notice be given to the owners, by advertisement in one or more newspapers of the borough or county of York, for three successive weeks, of the time and place appointed for the payment of the instalment, and that the same will be forfeited to the said association if not paid.
