Toll gates. SECTION 4. That whenever the said company shall have completed four miles of the said turnpike road, they shall have the right to erect toll gates and receive toll upon that portion of the road thus finished.

Damages. SECTION 5. That whenever the said road shall be laid and located upon the line of any township or county road, then and in such case no further or other damages shall be paid to the parties through whose land the same may pass, than the amount assessed and laid by the viewers who laid out such road, and assessed the damages under the road laws of this commonwealth.

AN ACT

Relative to the trust estate of Elizabeth Wilson, of Washington county.

Court of common pleas of Washington county authorized to direct the trustees under a certain indenture, to re-convey certain property.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the court of common pleas of Washington county, Pennsylvania, is hereby authorized at its discretion, to direct and require the trustees under a certain indenture and deed of trust executed by Thomas M'Kean Wilson, Elizabeth Murdoch, Eliza Murdoch and John L. Gowe, on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and recorded in the office for recording of deeds for the said county, in book V, volume 2, folios 147-8-9, and on the eighteenth February, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, whereby certain estate belonging to the said Elizabeth Murdock, now Elizabeth Wilson, was intended to be secured to herself and children, to re-convey the same to the said Elizabeth, and upon such conveyance and transfer of the said property, to discharge the said trustees from all liability on account of the said trust: *Provided,* That the said trustees shall satisfy the said court, that they have not received any part of the said estate as yet into their possession: *And provided also,* That such authority

shall not be exercised, except on the application of the said Elizabeth, to be made in writing to the said court.

A N A C T

In relation to the district of Penn, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners of the district of Penn, in the county of Philadelphia, are hereby authorized and it shall and may be lawful for them to pitch and pave the Ridge road between the curbs, and to lay the curb stone and to grade and pave the foot-ways on the said Ridge road, from the north line of the said district of Penn, in the county of Philadelphia, to the south line thereof, or so much of it as the said commissioners may deem expedient; and to assess and collect the costs thereof against the estates in front of which the said improvement may be done, according to the ordinances now in force in the said district for the same purposes; and so much of said road as has been pitched, curbed and paved by the commissioners aforesaid, shall be deemed proper as if this act had been in full force at the time, and shall be subject to the same.

Commissioners of district of Penn authorized to pitch and pave the Ridge road, &c.

Assess and collect costs.

SECTION 2. That the said commissioners shall first obtain the consent of the president and board of directors of the Ridge Road turnpike company for the same, and that the agreement made by the president and board of directors of the Ridge Road turnpike company, and the commissioners of the said district, or by a majority of them, shall be recorded in the office of the recorder of deeds in and for the city and county of Philadelphia.

Commissioners first to obtain consent of Ridge road turnpike company.

SECTION 3. That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to prevent the said Ridge Road turnpike company, from collecting the tolls upon the said road when paved, and that the said Ridge Road turnpike company shall keep the road or street in good repair at their own expense.

Collector of tolls, &c.

SECTION 4. That neither the twenty-ninth section of the act of assembly, passed the sixteenth day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, entitled "An Act to authorize the committee of the estate of Michael Fox, a lunatic, to sell and convey certain real estate, and for other purposes;" nor the third section of the
