

district, to be called Clarksburg district, and as such shall have power to elect all such officers, and have all the rights and privileges granted by law to other school districts; and the elections thereof shall be held at John G. Thompson's office, in said district, until a school house be erected in and for said district; then the elections of said district to be held at said school house, and on the day and in the manner provided by law for holding the elections in the adjoining districts; and the qualified electors of said district shall, at their first election, elect three school directors for the said district, one to serve one year, one to serve two years, and one to serve three years; and there shall be elected in each year, one or more directors to fill the vacancy or vacancies that may occur, and said election shall be conducted by two qualified electors, as may be present at the time for opening said election; and the said directors shall have power to levy, assess and collect all school tax for said district, and to receive for the use of said district so much of the state appropriation as belongs thereto.

SECTION 3. That at all spring elections hereafter held in the borough of Harrisburg, the candidates for justice of the peace and constable, shall be voted for on separate tickets.

SECTION 4. That all that part of Beaver township, in the county of Jefferson, which was heretofore taken from Ringgold township, upon the erection of Beaver township, so far as relates to schools and the collection of school taxes, shall be held and regarded as if no division of Ringgold township had been made; and the school directors of Ringgold township shall have power to exercise their authority as such, over all that part of Ringgold township incorporated into the boundaries of Beaver township, with like power and authority as if the act erecting Beaver township had not been passed.

AN ACT

Relating to a certain map of Smethport, M'Kean county; and relative to the state map.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the recorder of deeds for the county of M'Kean is hereby authorized*

and required to receive and file in his office, a certain map of the village of Smethport, in said county, which map was made and subscribed by John King, surveyor, and by the said John King affirmed to on the twenty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, before Lewis R. Hawkins, a justice of the peace in said county, together with the description thereto attached and affirmed to, and signed by the said John King as aforesaid; and that the said recorder make or cause to be made, an accurate copy thereof on the book kept for the recording of deeds in said county, which map and description when so filed, and the copy thereof so made as aforesaid, shall be received and read in all suits or actions where the same may be relevant as evidence of the matters contained.

SECTION 2. That the provisions of resolution number thirteen, granting to Rufus L. Barnes and William E. Morris, the use, on certain conditions, of the plates of the state map, which resolution was approved March fifteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, be and the same are hereby continued for the period of three years from the fifteenth of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty: *Provided however*, That said Rufus L. Barnes and William E. Morris, shall furnish to any school director applying for the same, for the use of any public school in this commonwealth, copies of said map properly mounted and colored, at the cost of three dollars per copy.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That George S.
