## AN ACT

Authorizing the canal commissioners to examine the claim of William H. Richardson and company, for the destruction of salt works on dam number two, on the Kiskiminetas river.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and directed to examine the alleged claims of William H. Richardson and company, for the destruction and loss of a salt well and works in repairing dam number two, on the Kiskiminetas river, for occupation of houses by the state hands, and for stone and timber taken and used for said dam, and for stoppages of their saw mill by backwater from the pool of said dam; and to assess the damages they shall deem the claimants justly entitled to, and report the same to the legislature, if, in their opinion, the said claimants be entitled to any.

## AN ACT

To confer on Edgar Monroe Ruhl, of York county, the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Edgar Monroe Ruhl, son of Noah and Maria Ruhl, of Shewsbury township, York county, shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock; and shall be able and capable

in law to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever, as fully and effectually as if he had been born in lawful wedlock.

### AN ACT

Supplementary to an act passed Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, incorporating the borough of Shrewsbury, in York county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* from and after the passage of this act it shall be lawful for the town council of the borough of Shrewsbury aforesaid, to survey, lay out and open the necessary streets and alleys in said borough: *Provided, That* no street or alley shall be laid out or opened unless by a petition signed by a majority of the taxable inhabitants of said borough, asking or praying the said council to lay out and open the same; and any damages that may accrue in consequence of said laying out and opening, shall be determined by five disinterested persons, chosen from the adjoining townships, two of whom shall be chosen by the damage claimants, and two by the said town council, and the fifth to be chosen by the consent of both parties, who shall receive for their services each one dollar per day; which sum, together with the amount of damages, shall be paid by said corporation.
