

company may, from time to time, by a vote of the stockholders, had at a meeting called for the purpose, increase their capital stock, if it shall be deemed necessary to carry out the true intent and meaning of this act.

Commencement
and completion of
road.

SECTION 3. That, if said company shall not commence the construction of said road in three years, and complete the same within six years from the passage of this act, then this act shall be null and void, except so far as the same may be necessary to wind up and settle the affairs, and pay the debts of the company.

Repeal.

SECTION 4. That so much of the act approved the twenty-ninth March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Susquehanna and Bald Eagle plank road company," as is superseded by this act, is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

Relating to the drawing of juries in the counties of Berks and Bedford; relating to the commissioners of Dauphin county; and relative to the removal of paupers in Berks county.

WHEREAS, By the act of the general assembly, passed the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, the courts in Berks shall be in each term for three weeks; and no provision being made to select, summon and return jurors for the said third week in each term; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That in addition to the panel of names as now returned for the first and second week for each term of the court in said county, a third panel of names shall be returned for the third week, to serve in and through said third week; and that every thing shall be done and observed, in relation thereto, as is prescribed by law in the like case.

SECTION 2. That in addition to the panel of names now returned for the first week of each term of the several courts of Bedford county, a second panel of names shall be returned for the second week of said courts, in and through said second week, whenever the judges of the said courts may order a court for two weeks in said county; and every

thing shall be done, in relation thereto, as is prescribed by law in similar cases.

SECTION 3. That so much of the third section of the act, entitled "An Act to reduce the expenses in Montgomery county, and relative to the treasury of Dauphin county," approved the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, as prevents mileage being allowed the county commissioners and directors of the poor of the county of Dauphin, shall be and is hereby repealed. Commissioners of Dauphin county, relative to.

SECTION 4. That the directors of the poor and house of employment of the county of Berks, shall be and they are hereby authorized to regulate the mileage and compensation for removing paupers to said poor house; such mileage never to be less than ten, nor more than to. Directors of the poor of Berks county, relative to.
twenty cents per mile.

AN ACT

Authorizing the laying out of a state road from Cannonsburg, in Washington county, to Connellsville, in Fayette county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Henry Yeagley, of Fayette county, and Greer M'Ilvaine and Matthew Linn, of Washington county, be and are hereby appointed commissioners to view and lay out a road, beginning at or near Cannonsburg, in Washington county, to Connellsville, in Fayette county. Commissioners. Location.

SECTION 2. That the said commissioners, after taking and subscribing an oath or affirmation to perform the duties enjoined on them by this act, with fidelity and impartiality, shall proceed to view the ground and lay out the road as near a straight line between the said points as the nature of the ground will permit, so that the verticle departure from a horizontal line shall in no point exceed five degrees, except at the crossing of ravines and streams, where by a moderate excavation, filling or bridging, the declination of said road may be preserved within that limit. Commissioners, duties of.

SECTION 3. Said commissioners shall meet on or before the first day of September next, and proceed to complete the view of said road; and they are hereby authorized to employ as surveyor John Nelson H. Patrick, at a per diem not exceeding two dollars per day, and two Authorized to employ surveyors, &c., pay of.
