

chain-bearers and one axeman, who shall receive one dollar; and the said commissioners shall receive one dollar and fifty cents each, for every day necessarily spent in discharge of the duties enjoined by this act; and the amount required to pay the expenses as thus provided, shall be paid by warrant drawn on the commissioners of Fayette and Washington counties, in proportion to the time spent in each county respectively.

Further duties of commissioners. **Drafts of road to be filed.** **Damages, how to be adjusted.**

SECTION 4. It shall be the duties of said commissioners to make a fair and accurate draft of the location of said road, noting courses and distances, improvements, roads, township lines and waters, one copy of which shall be deposited in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, on or before the first day of January next after the survey is completed, and one copy in the office of the clerk of the court of each county in which said road may lie; and from thenceforth the said road shall be a public highway, and shall be opened and repaired in all respects as roads are opened and repaired by order of the courts of quarter sessions of said counties.

SECTION 5. It shall be the duties of the said commissioners to endeavor to procure from all persons through whose land said road is located, releases for all claims of damages which might arise from opening the said road; and in all cases where a release cannot be obtained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof, signed by a majority of them, which, with the releases, shall be returned to the courts of quarter sessions of the respective counties in which such damages may accrue.

AN ACT

Authorizing Joseph Boone to sell and convey certain real estate in Clearfield county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Joseph Boone, trustee named in a certain deed of conveyance, whereof Joseph Boone and Priscilla, his wife, are the grantors, dated the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, is hereby empowered and authorized to sell, at public or private sale, and to convey and assure to the purchaser or purchasers, in fee simple, all that certain tract of land situate in Penn township, Clearfield county, and*

state aforesaid, beginning at a white pine corner, on a line between Joseph Boone and James Moore's land; thence south sixty-five degrees east seventy perches to a post; thence north twenty-five degrees east one hundred and twenty-one and a half perches to a post; thence north sixty-five degrees west seventy perches to a post; thence south twenty-five degrees west one hundred and twenty-one and a half perches to the place of beginning, containing fifty acres and twenty five perches and allowance: *Provided*, The said trustees give good and sufficient surety, to be approved of by the court, for the faithful performance of their trust.

AN ACT

To repeal an act passed the tenth day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, entitled, "An Act changing the mode of electing the officers of the Springhouse, Northamptontown and Bethlehem turnpike road company," and to revive so much of the original act, passed January the sixteenth, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, as was thereby repealed.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the act, entitled "An Act changing the mode of electing the officers of the Springhouse, Northamptontown and Bethlehem turnpike road company," approved April the tenth, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, be and the same is hereby repealed; and that so much of the original act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the stockholders of said turnpike company," passed January the sixteenth, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, as was repealed by the aforesaid act of April tenth, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, be and the same is hereby revived.
