A SUPPLEMENT

To an act passed April fifth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, relative to the borough of Clarksville, Mercer county; and extending an act relative to voting at elections to said county; and relative to election districts in Mifflin county.

Certain privileges granted to the borough of Clarksville.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the borough of Clarksville shall have all the rights and privileges now granted to townships in this commonwealth, to elect officers, collect taxes, et cetera; and that they shall hold their elections in the public school house in said borough, first Friday in May next, and on the third Friday of March in every year thereafter, and that the officers now authorized to hold elections for inspectors and judge, be authorized and required to hold the elections for borough and township officers at the same time and place.

Power to prevent the running at large of geese, swine and dogs.

SECTION 2. That the burgess and town council shall have power to prevent the running at large of geese, swine and dogs in said borough, and they are hereby authorized to seize and sell, in such manner as shall be provided by an ordinance of said corporation, to impose fines and penalties, incurring forfeiture and sale as they may direct.

Provisions of certain act extended to Mercer county.

SECTION 3. That the act, entitled "An Act relative to voting at elections in the counties of Adams, Dauphin, York, Lancaster, Franklin, Cumberland, Bradford, Centre, Greene and Erie," approved the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and all the provisions thereof, be and is hereby extended to the county of Mercer, as fully as if that county had been mentioned therein.

Newton Hamilton, the place of holding elections in, changed.

SECTION 4. That the qualified electors of the borough of Newton Hamilton, and the township of Wayne, in the county of Mifflin, shall after the next spring elections, hold their general and township elections at the new school house now building in the borough of Newton Hamilton.
