AN ACT

To refund to John H. Dohnert, late treasurer of the county of Philadelphia, certain moneys over-paid by him; and relative to fees allowed to the treasurers of Lycoming and Clinton counties.

WHEREAS, John H. Dohnert, late treasurer of the county of Philadelphia, in the settlement of his accounts on the fourth day of February, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, made an over-payment to the commonwealth, amounting to the sum of eleven hundred and ninety-two dollars and seventy-six cents; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to John H. Dohnert, late treasurer of the county of Philadelphia, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of eleven hundred and ninety-two dollars and seventy-six cents.

SECTION 2. That so much of the first and third sections of the act of the twenty-sixth of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, entitled "An Act providing that the treasurers of Lycoming and Schuylkill counties, shall receive a fixed salary, and regulating fees in certain cases, and for other purposes," as fixes the treasurer's fee for advertising each tract of unseated land in Lycoming and Clinton counties, including printer's charges, at twenty cents, be and the same is hereby repealed; and from and after the passage of this act, the same fees shall be allowed the treasurers of said counties for advertising as aforesaid, as are fixed by the act of the twenty-eighth of March, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, entitled "An Act establishing a fee bill."
