A N A C T

To vacate a certain public alley in the town of Lisburn, Cumberland county, and to lay out another public alley in lieu thereof; and in relation to the borough of New Cumberland.

WHEREAS, The citizens of Lisburn and vicinity, in the county of Cumberland, suffer great inconveniences in passing to and from their public burial ground; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all that public alley leading from the village of Lisburn to the public burial ground near said village, be and the same is hereby vacated; and that John G. and Jacob Heck are hereby authorized and required at their own expense, to open a public alley from the street running through said village of Lisburn to the said burial ground, along the west side of the head race of their mills.

Certain alley in the village of Lisburn, vacated.

SECTION 2. That the town council of the borough of New Cumberland, in the county of Cumberland, shall have full power and authority to make all such rules and regulations as they shall from time to time deem proper, for the landing and drawing of lumber, timber and all other kinds of produce, on the shore of the river Susquehanna, within the limits of said borough, and on the public ground lying between Water street and the said river; and also to levy such a sum upon all persons landing rafts, arks, shingles, staves, wood, bark, stone, or any other kind of produce or merchandize, as they shall see proper: *Provided,* That the sum so levied shall not for five years from the passage of this act, exceed three cents on every thousand superficial feet of sawed lumber, three cents on every thousand shingles, four cents on every thousand hoghead, barrel or cask staves, three cents on every one hundred rails; cord wood or bark, ton of coal or perch of stone, and other produce, at similar charges, nor more than twenty-five cents on each and every timber or log raft or empty ark.

SECTION 3. Should any person or persons owning a lot on Water street, erect a steam saw mill, and desire to construct a log or cause-

way down to the river, for the drawing of their timber into their mill, he or they shal have power to erect the same and continue the same: *Provided*, Such log or causeway shall be so constructed that it will not interfere with any road or street leading to the river or down the bank to the river or landing or drawing of lumber.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Evangelical Lutheran congregations of Old Goshenhoppen, Indian Field and Tobicken, and the trustees of the Presbyterian church at Spruce creek, to sell certain real estate.

Trustees of the Evangelical Lutheran congregations of Old Goshenhoppen, Indian Field and Tobicken authorized to sell certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Daniel Jacoby, George Bilger and Michael Lutz, the trustees of the parsonage of the Evangelical Lutheran congregation of Old Goshenhoppen, Indian Field and Tobicken, in the counties of Bucks and Montgomery, or their successors in office, be and they are hereby authorized to sell at public sale, and convey to the purchaser or purchasers in fee, such part and so much as said congregations have directed and agreed upon, of the parsonage belonging to said congregations, consisting of a messuage and tract of land, situated in Upper Salford township, Montgomery county aforesaid, containing one hundred and forty-five acres and one perch, with allowance of six per cent. for road, more or less, which said congregations hold under an indenture made by George Egbert and wife, to Michael Croll and others, in trust for the use of said congregations, dated the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three, recorded in the recorder's office of the city and county of Philadelphia, in deed book No. 10, page 121, adjoining lands of Peter Nace, and others: *Provided*, That the trustees of the said parsonage of said congregations before said sale, shall enter into bond with surety, in the name of the commonwealth, to be approved by said congregations, and in such penalty as they may direct, conditioned that said trustees shall pay over the proceeds of said sale, and put the same out to interest on good security, and apply the interest as in this act is directed.
