

of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers thereof; and such deed shall be deemed and taken to vest the title to the premises so sold, in the purchaser, as fully to all intents and purposes, as said congregations had and held the same; and the proceeds of said sale shall be put out to interest on land or other security, to be approved by said congregations, in the name of the trustees and their successors, for the use of said congregations; and the interest accruing and arising on the amount of such moneys, shall from time to time be applied by the trustees of said congregations to improving the remaining part of said parsonage or tract of land, and repairing and renewing or enlarging the buildings thereon, in such manner as said congregations may direct, but no part of the principal of the proceeds of such sale, shall be used for said purposes.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Waynesboro', Quincy, Funkstown and Fayetteville turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That John Moyn, junior, David Wertz, senior, John Darby, Peter Cook, James Crawford, Henry George, David Bigham, George M'Ferren, Frederick Byers, John Duncan, Holker Hughes, John Small, Daniel Miller, Daniel W. Royer, Jacob Price, (of Jacob,) Jacob C. Secrist, Alexander Hamilton, George Besore, James Burns, George Winters, James M'Kinley, Henry Besore, John Huber, senior, Abraham Burger and doctor Thomas Walker, of the county of Franklin, or any five of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions, and organize a company by the name, style and title of "The Waynesboro', Quincy, Funkstown and Fayetteville turnpike road company," to locate and construct a turnpike road on the site of the present road, (or otherwise as the said company shall direct,) leading from Waynesboro', in Franklin county, via Quincy and Funkstown, to Fayetteville, in said county, subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act, entitled "An Act regulating turnpike and plank

Subject to provisions of certain act. road companies," approved the twenty-sixth day of January, Anno Domini; one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplement thereto, approved the seventh day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, so far as the said act and supplement are not inconsistent with the provisions of this act.

Capital stock. SECTION 2. That the capital stock of the said company shall consist of fifteen hundred shares, at twenty dollars per share: *Provided*, That the said company may from time to time, at a meeting or meetings of the stockholders, called for that purpose, increase their capital stock to such an amount as in their opinion may be required to complete the said road, according to the true intent and meaning of this act.

Point of commencement of road. SECTION 3. That the said company may commence the construction of their road at any intermediate point: *Provided*, That such commencement shall be made within five years after the passage of this act; and should the said company fail to complete their road within ten years from and after the same shall have been commenced, then this act shall be null and void, except so far as the same may be necessary for the purpose of settling the affairs and paying the debts of the company: *And provided*, That the said road at its northern termination, shall intersect the Chambersburg and Gettysburg turnpike road, at any point between Jacob B. Cook's store and Robert Black's store, on said turnpike road.

AN ACT

Relative to a certain drain in Dauphin county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That all the land-holders in Susquehanna township, in the county of Dauphin, through whose lands a drain was constructed by the canal commissioners for the purpose of carrying off the leakage from the Pennsylvania canal, are hereby required, at their individual cost and expense, to keep open said drain at all times hereafter.

SECTION 2. That if any of said land-holders shall refuse to comply with the provisions of this act, it shall be the duty of the supervisor of said Susquehanna township then in office, on notice to him given for
