SECTION 4. That the section of the law incorporating said company which regulates the voting for officers thereof, and which, literally construed, allows two votes for each share of stock not exceeding two shares, held by any stockholder, shall be construed to allow but one vote for each share of stock not exceeding two : *Provided*, That this section shall not in any way affect the number of votes each stockholder is entitled to under the original law, for any number of shares held by him above two shares. A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An Act directing the manner of serving writs of summons in certain cases in the county of Mercer;" and relative to streets in the borough of Indiana.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the provisions of the first, second and third sections of the act, entitled "An Act directing the manner of serving writs of summons in certain cases in the county of Mercer," approved the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, be and the same are hereby extended to the counties of Armstrong, Indiana, Somerset, Bedford, Clinton and Cambria. Provisions of certain act relative to serving writs of summons, extended to the counties of Somerset, Bedford and Cambria.

SECTION 2. That the act of assembly, entitled "An Act regulating streets in the borough of Indiana, in the county of Indiana," passed the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, shall be so construed as to give full power to the burgess and town council of said borough, to make and lay out a street of the width and description mentioned in the act aforesaid, from Clymer street, at James Mitchell's, to Mahoning street, at Robert B. Moorhead's, and to take and occupy any portion of ground outside of the line of the borough that may be necessary for said purpose. Construction of certain act regulating streets in the borough of Indiana.

SECTION 3. That the act of assembly aforesaid shall not be construed in any part thereof, so as to give to the said burgess and town council power to assess damages, or to make any contracts to pay damages arising out of said act, but in all cases the said damages shall be fixed as prescribed in the act aforesaid, and the report of the viewers Further construction.

shall not be deemed binding until the same shall have been approved of by the court.

AN ACT

Authorizing individuals to construct railroads and plank roads in the county of Venango; relating to road taxes in Washington county; the navigation of Oswego creek; and the Farmers' and Mechanics' turnpike road company; authorizing the sale of real estate in Lewisburg, Union county; and relative to the Edgemont great road, in Delaware county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the second section of an act, entitled "An Act authorizing the paving of the Gray's Ferry road from Cedar street to Federal street; providing for the construction of lateral railroads; relating to the appointment of auctioneers in the county of Erie, Mercer and Bradford; extending the Southwark railroad; and in relation to the collection of poor taxes in the city of Pittsburg," passed the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, be and the same is hereby extended to Venango county.

Provisions of 2nd section of certain act extended to Venango county.

John Harper of Cecil township, Washington county, authorized to collect taxes.

Provisions of certain act extended to Oswego creek.

Farmers' and Mechanics' turnpike road company authorized to change their road.

SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, John Harper, of Cecil township, county of Washington, is hereby authorized and empowered to collect the outstanding road tax due him as supervisor of said township, prior to the year eighteen hundred and forty four.

SECTION 3. That the provisions of the act, entitled "An Act to prevent the obstructing of the navigation of the Big Brokenstraw creek, in Warren county," passed the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, be and is hereby extended to the Oswego creek, in the counties of Potter and M'Kean.

SECTION 4. That the president and managers of the Farmers' and Mechanics' turnpike road company, in Allegheny county, be and they are hereby authorized, with the consent of the sequestrator of said road, to convert their road or any portion thereof, into a plank road, under the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, passed the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplement thereto.
