AN ACT

To legitimate John R. Johnston, of Sacramento city, California, and Charles Bennett, of the county of Luzerne, in the state of Pennsylvania; also, Samuel Lee, California Lee and Lurany Lee, of Armstrong county; to change the name of Jacob Lindecoogel, of Lehigh county; to extend the time for the completion of the Danville railroad; to declare the East Fork of Sinnemahoning creek a public highway; relative to the estate of David Bacon, deceased; and correcting an error in a certain act of assembly.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* John R. Johnston, now resident at Sacramento city, California, son of John R. Johnston, of Allegheny city, in the county of Allegheny, and of Hannah Boyer, formerly of Armstrong county, shall enjoy and possess all the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock. John R. Johnston, of California, legitimated.

SECTION 2. That Charles Bennett, of the county of Luzerne, son of John Bennett, of the same county, shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock; and shall be able and capable in law to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever, as fully mated and effectually as if he had been born in lawful wedlock. Charles Bennett, of Luzerne county, legitimated.

SECTION 3. That Samuel Lee, California Lee and Lurany Lee, children of H. N. Lee, of Armstrong county, shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of children born in lawful wedlock; and shall be able and capable in law to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever, as fully and effectually as if they had been born in lawful wedlock. Samuel, California and Lurany Lee, legitimated.

SECTION 4. That Jacob Lindecoogel, of the county of Lehigh, be and he is hereby authorized to change his name from Jacob Lindecoogel to Jacob Lind, and he shall henceforth be called and known by the name of Jacob Lind; and by that name shall be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, grant and receive, and do all other legal acts as effectually, to all intents and purposes, as he could have done by his former name if no change had been made therein. Jacob Lindecoogel, name changed from.

SECTION 5. That the time for the commencement and completion of the Danville railroad, incorporated by the act of the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty, be and is hereby extended for another period of five years, and after the time now allowed for the commencement and completion thereof. Danville railroad, time of commencement and completion of, extended.

SECTION 6. That the East Fork Sinnemahoning creek, from the mouth thereof to the mouth of Jamison branch of said East Fork, in Potter county, be and the same is hereby declared a public highway: East Fork, Sinnemahoning creek, declared a public highway. *Provided, That* nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize any interference with the mill privileges of Benjamin Bunnell; and that the channel north of the island above the mill of said Bunnell, be declared a public highway.

SECTION 7. That Joseph Bacon, Charles W. Bacon, and Edmund P. Bacon, trustees named in the last will and testament of David Bacon, deceased, are hereby authorized and empowered to accept a conveyance of all or any of the lots or pieces of ground therein mentioned, and again to let the same on ground rent by indenture, and in the usual manner and form that lots in the county of Philadelphia are let, with the conveyance, &c. Trustees under the will of David Bacon, deceased, authorized to accept a conveyance, &c.

nants for building and payments of rent, to such person or persons as shall be desirous of taking the same: *Provided*, That such letting shall be subject to at least as great a yearly rent as the one originally reserved, and that they shall hold the same subject to the same trusts.

Correction of the word "securing" in certain act relating to the estate of John Wood, deceased.

SECTION 8. That the word securing, where it occurs in the second section of the act of assembly, approved on the twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, entitled "An Act relative to the estate of John Wood, deceased; and relative to the estate of Casper Coxen, deceased," shall be and is hereby changed to the word receiving; and the said section shall be construed as if the alteration herein designated had been made in the said section before the same was passed.

AN ACT

To incorporate the president and managers of the Clarion, Tylersburg and Tionesta turnpike road company; and relative to the collection of road taxes in Antes and Woodberry townships, Blair county; and to a state road in Schuylkill county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That J. B. Loomis, William Alexander, Daniel Walters, John Fogelbacher, James Hilands, esquire, John Walters, Robert P. Hilands, Andrew Fleming and Jacob Shriber be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions and organize a company by the name, style and title of "The Clarion, Tylersburg and Tionesta turnpike road company;" with power to construct a turnpike road from the borough of Clarion, in the county of Clarion, by the most practicable route to Tylersburg, in said county, and thence to the village of Tionesta, in Venango county, subject to the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, except those hereinafter mentioned.

SECTION 2. The capital stock of said company shall consist of two thousand shares of twenty-five dollars each.

SECTION 3. That the president and managers may so construct and grade the road, that the same shall in no place rise or fall in an angle of more than five degrees from a horizontal line.
