AN ACT

To incorporate the president and managers of the York and Gettysburg plank road company.

Commissioners.	SECTION 1. <i>Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,</i> That Robert Smith, George Swope, John B. M'Pherson, Alexander R. Stevenson, George W. M'Clellan, John L. Tate, James A. Thompson, Joel B. Danner, Moses M'Clean, William D. Himes, Michael Hoffman, colonel John J. Kuhn, Andrew Heinzelman, Thomas C. Hambley, Philip Smyser, George Hay, C. A. Morris, S. Small and William M'Sherry, be and they, or any three of them are hereby appointed commissioners to open books to receive subscriptions and organize a company by the name, style and title of "The York and Gettysburg plank road company," with power to construct a plank road commencing at Gettysburg, in Adams county, and thence by the most practicable route to the borough of York, in the county of York, or to such point on the Baltimore and Susquehanna railroad, or on the Hanover branch thereof, as the stockholders or directors may determine upon.

Location.	
Subject to provisions of certain act.	subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, passed the twenty sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and of the supplement thereto, passed the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.
Capital stock.	SECTION 2. That the capital stock of said company shall consist of two thousand five hundred shares, at twenty-five dollars per share: <i>Provided,</i> That said company may from time to time by a vote of the stockholders, at a meeting called for that purpose, increase their capital stock so much as in their opinion may be necessary to complete the road, and to carry out the true intent and meaning of this act.
Commencement and completion of road.	SECTION 3. That if said company shall not commence the construction of said road in three years, and complete the same within six years from the passage of this act, then this act shall be null and void, except so far as the same may be necessary to wind up and settle the affairs and pay the debts of the company.
Said company authorized to purchase the bed of the York and Gettysburg turnpike road, &c.	SECTION 4. <i>And be it further enacted,</i> That the company hereby created is authorized to purchase, and the York and Gettysburg turnpike company are hereby authorized to sell to the former, the bed of their road, with all the franchise thereto belonging, to be used and occupied by the said York and Gettysburg plank road, for the purposes of their road: <i>Provided,</i> That two-thirds in value of the stockholders of each company shall first have consented thereto, either in writing or at a general meeting of the stockholders of each, to be called for that purpose, on notice given in the manner prescribed in other cases; but such notice shall set forth the special objects of meeting.
Further provisions.	SECTION 5. <i>And be it further enacted,</i> That the price at which such sale shall be made, shall be distributed to and amongst the stockholders of the said York and Gettysburg turnpike company, in the proportion of the stock by each of them respectively owned and held, and

certificates of stock in the York and Gettysburg plank road company shall be issued of each of the stockholders in the said turnpike company, for the amount of their share in the price aforesaid: *Provided*, That in case of stockholders of said turnpike company who shall not have given their assent in writing as above, or who shall not have been present at said meeting, the amount of their quota of the price of said turnpike shall be paid to them on demand, at any time within three years after such sale shall have been made as aforesaid; and in such case the stock in the said plank road company, allotted to such persons, shall revert to the said company.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Odd Fellows hall association of Milton, Northumberland county; and relative to the sale of certain church property in said borough.

WHEREAS, Certain citizens of this commonwealth hereinafter named, have associated together for the purpose of erecting an Odd Fellows hall in the borough of Milton, Northumberland county, and have with certain moneys raised by issuing certificates of stock and certificates of loan, purchased a lot or piece of ground situate on the west side of Front street, in said borough of Milton, and erected on the same a large three story brick hall, for the accommodation of the Order of Odd Fellows and the citizens of the borough generally; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That David L. Irland, James Buoy, Samuel Blair, John M. Huff, John Y. Goodlander, George Baker, Aaron W. Comly, Robert M. Frick, Israel Kepler, Isaiah B. Davis, Paul Masteller, A. W. Rhawn, Joseph Angstadt, and their successors, and all persons who are now or may be hereafter associated with them, be and they are hereby created and erected into a body politic and corporate in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The Odd Fellows hall association of the borough of Milton," and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in any court of law or equity and elsewhere; and shall be able and capable in law and equity, to take and hold to them and their successors, either by gift, grant, devise or lease, any lands or real estate for the use of the
