

certificates of stock in the York and Gettysburg plank road company shall be issued of each of the stockholders in the said turnpike company, for the amount of their share in the price aforesaid: *Provided*, That in case of stockholders of said turnpike company who shall not have given their assent in writing as above, or who shall not have been present at said meeting, the amount of their quota of the price of said turnpike shall be paid to them on demand, at any time within three years after such sale shall have been made as aforesaid; and in such case the stock in the said plank road company, allotted to such persons, shall revert to the said company.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Odd Fellows hall association of Milton, Northumberland county; and relative to the sale of certain church property in said borough.

WHEREAS, Certain citizens of this commonwealth hereinafter named, have associated together for the purpose of erecting an Odd Fellows hall in the borough of Milton, Northumberland county, and have with certain moneys raised by issuing certificates of stock and certificates of loan, purchased a lot or piece of ground situate on the west side of Front street, in said borough of Milton, and erected on the same a large three story brick hall, for the accommodation of the Order of Odd Fellows and the citizens of the borough generally; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That David L. Irland, James Buoy, Samuel Blair, John M. Huff, John Y. Goodlander, George Baker, Aaron W. Comly, Robert M. Frick, Israel Kepler, Isaiah B. Davis, Paul Masteller, A. W. Rhawn, Joseph Angstadt, and their successors, and all persons who are now or may be hereafter associated with them, be and they are hereby created and erected into a body politic and corporate in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The Odd Fellows hall association of the borough of Milton," and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in any court of law or equity and elsewhere; and shall be able and capable in law and equity, to take and hold to them and their successors, either by gift, grant, devise or lease, any lands or real estate for the use of the

- said association; and also to take and hold for the use of the said association, any goods and chattels, sum or sums of money, by gift, grant, bargain and sale, will, devise or bequest, for any person or persons whatsoever capable of making the same, and the same at their pleasure to grant, bargain, sell or lease for the use of the said association, and generally to do and perform all and singular the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do and perform for the well being and due management of the affairs of the said association: *Provided*, That the real estate of which the said corporation shall at any time be possessed, shall not exceed the clear yearly value of five thousand dollars: *And provided also*, That the certificates of stock and certificates of loan already issued for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, shall be assumed by the said the Odd Fellows hall association of the borough of Milton, who shall pay the interest now due, or that may hereafter become due on the same, and redeem the same whenever they shall respectively become due and payable; the liability of the said association for the payment of the said interest, and the redemption of the said certificates, to be the same as if they had been issued by the said association in virtue of law: *And provided also*, That from and immediately after the passage of this act, the title to the said lot or piece of ground, and the hall and other buildings thereon erected, shall be vested in the Odd Fellows hall association of the borough of Milton, as fully, to all intents and purposes, as the same is held by the persons hereinbefore mentioned.
- SECTION 2.** The stockholders shall meet annually on the last Saturday in December in each year, and choose by ballot five trustees, who shall serve until their successors are elected; a majority of the whole number of votes polled shall constitute a choice, and in the event of a failure to elect any of the said trustees at any regular election, or in case there shall be a vacancy or vacancies in the board of trustees, growing out of any cause whatever, such action shall be taken as the said association shall by its by-laws provide. At the first meeting of the trustees after their election in each year, they shall elect from their body a president, secretary and treasurer, and such other officers as the business of the corporation may require: *Provided*, That the trustees and officers now managing the affairs of the said Odd Fellows hall association shall continue as trustees and officers of the corporation hereby created, till the regular election shall be held as before provided.
- SECTION 3.** That it shall and may be lawful for the said corporation to have a common seal, and the same at their will and pleasure to change, alter and renew as they may think proper; and shall have and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities necessary for the purposes of the corporation hereby constituted and as herein expressed.
- SECTION 4.** The government of the said association, and the management and disposition of its affairs, and the property, shall be vested in the said board of trustees.
- SECTION 5.** The corporation shall have power and authority to make by-laws conformable to this charter, and not inconsistent with the laws of the United States or of this commonwealth.
- SECTION 6.** That the legislature hereby reserves the right to alter, revoke or annul the charter of the said the Odd Fellows hall association of the borough of Milton, whenever, in their opinion, it may be injurious to the citizens of this commonwealth; in such manner, however, that no injustice shall be done to the incorporators.
- SECTION 7.** That Thomas Strine, trustee of the Evangelical Lutheran congregation of the borough of Milton, Northumberland county, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sell, either at public

To incorporate the Odd Fellows hall association of Perry county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That J. Miller, Jesse Coffman and Jacob Meck, and their successors, and all persons who now are or hereafter may be associated with them, be and they are hereby created and erected into a body politic and corporate in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The Odd Fellows hall association of Perry county," and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any court of law or equity or elsewhere; and shall be able and capable in law and in equity, to take and hold, to them and their successors, either by grant, gift, devise, lease or otherwise, any lands or real estate, for the purpose of erecting thereon a suitable building or buildings for the use of said association; and also, to take and hold, for the use of the said association, any goods and chattles, sum or sums of money, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, will, devise, bequest or otherwise, from any person or persons whatsoever, capable of making the same; and the same at their pleasure to grant, bargain and sell, for the use of said association, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do, for the well-being and due management of the affairs of said association: *Provided,* That the real estate of which the said corporation shall be at any time possessed, shall not exceed the clear yearly value of two thousand dollars.
