AN ACT

To incorporate the Mansfield plank road company; and relative to a school district in Huntingdon county.

- SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That
- Commissioners.** William B. Clymer, William Bache, Chester Robinson, George M'Loud, A. E. Nills, B. M. Bailey, Benjamin Gitchell, James Lowry, R. G. White, John Brownell, Joseph P. Morris, James R. Wilson, Daniel L. Sherwood, James S. Osgood, Benjamin Gitchell, William S. Ingalls, Peter V. Vaness, Royal Rose, J. S. Hoard, Benjamin B. Smith and Stephen F. Wilson, or any five of them, be and the same are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions and organize a company by the name, style and title of "The Mansfield plank road company," to locate and construct a plank road on the bed of the present public road or otherwise, as said company may direct, from Mansfield to Wellsboro', in the county of Tioga, subject to the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplement thereto, as far as they are not inconsistent with this and the following sections.

- Subject to provisions of certain act.**
- SECTION 2.** The capital stock of said company shall consist of one thousand shares of twenty-five dollars per share: *Provided,* Said company may from time to time, at a meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose, increase the capital stock to such an amount as in their opinion may be required to complete the same, according to the true intent and meaning of this act.
- Capital stock.**
- SECTION 3.** That said company are hereby authorized to extend the said plank road from Mansfield through the townships of Rutland and Jackson, in the county of Tioga, and the township of Wells, in the county of Bradford, to the state line near Shephard's Corners; and to increase the capital stock of said company as may become necessary to construct the same in the manner provided in the second section of this act.
- Said company authorized to extend their road.**
- SECTION 4.** That if said company shall not commence the construction of said road within three years from the passage of this act, and complete the same within seven years thereafter, this act shall be null and void, except so far as it may be necessary to wind up the affairs of said company and pay the debts of the same.
- Commencement and completion of road.**
- SECTION 5.** That the territory embraced within the following boundaries, to wit: beginning at the Juniata river, on the line between Porter and Morris townships, running through the lands of Joseph Green and others, to the line between the lands of John Davis and Benjamin Sprankle; thence to the line between the lands of Benjamin Sprankle and Jesse Moore; thence by line between lands of Michael Feterhoof and John Tussey; thence by line between lands of Michael Low and Robert Tussey; thence by line between lands of Samuel P. Wallace and the heirs of James Law; thence crossing the river; thence by line between lands of Dr. A. M'Pherrin and John Walters; thence by lines

between lands of John S. Isett and A. and D. Wright ; thence by line between lands of John S. Isett and John Elerts, and Shub, Stewart and company, and to the place of beginning; including lands of Benjamin Sprankle, Michael Fetterhoof, George Hickle, Michael Low, Dr. A. M'Pherrin, Jeremiah Wagoner, John S. Isett, and the town of Graysport, being parts of the townships of Franklin and Morris, in the county of Huntingdon, is hereby erected into a separate school district, to be called Graysport.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act incorporating the Western insurance company of the city of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny, passed the twentieth of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Additional power the company incorporated by the act to which this is a supplement, be ers granted to the and they are hereby authorized to receive deposits of money, and pay Western insurance company. any rate of interest on the same not exceeding six per cent. per annum, as the directors may determine.

SECTION 2. That said corporation shall, whenever required so to do, issue certificates for all money deposited with them, in trust, which certificates shall be transferable on the books of the institution, under such regulations as may be prescribed by the president and directors.
