AN ACT

To declare the width of South street, in the borough of Carlisle, Cumberland county; and a supplement to the act incorporating the Cumberland Valley mutual protection company, of Dickinson township.

Width of South street, Carlisle, fixed.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the width of South street, in the borough of Carlisle, shall be sixty feet as laid down in the plan of the borough; and that the width of that portion of the street running along the grave yard wall, in said borough, shall be sixty feet measured from said wall; and that the remainder of said street from the grave yard wall to Fort spring, shall be of the same width as the rest of South street, but shall be so regulated as not to interfere with the present limits of the lots on that portion of the street: Provided, A street sixty feet in width can be obtained without so interfering.*

Cumberland Valley mutual protection company.

SECTION 2. That the board of managers of the Cumberland Valley mutual protection company, of Dickinson township, shall have authority from and after the passage of this act, to appoint collectors whenever it may be necessary to collect the assessments that may be made on the premium notes of said company, and to fix the percentage they shall have for collecting the same; and the said collectors shall each give bond to the treasurer of said company, with good security, for the payment of all moneys so collected by them, to the treasurer of said company as soon as collected, and for the faithful performance of all duties that may be imposed upon him.
