A N A C T

For the relief of Jacob F. Herr, of Lancaster county; relative to the Willow Street turnpike road company; and to the real estate of Margaret Garret Kay.

Canal commis-
sioners to settle
claim of J. F.
Herr.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the board of canal commissioners be and are hereby authorized to examine, settle and adjust the alleged claim of Jacob F. Herr, occasioned by the breaking of the rope and collision at the inclined plane on the Philadelphia and Columbia railroad, and inquire, and if the same was caused by the negligence of any of the agents of the commonwealth, and report the same to the legislature.

Willow Street
turnpike road,

SECTION 2. That the president and managers of the Willow Street turnpike road company are hereby authorized to change the location of said road as laid out in the law incorporating said company, if they shall think it advisable to do so; that they may go off of the Lancaster and Willow Street road, and go any distance therefrom along the same: they shall also have power and authority to straighten the said Lancaster and Willow Street road, or to alter the curves thereof wherever and whenever they may think proper to do so; the damages to property to be ascertained and governed in all respects by the provisions of the general law regulating turnpike and plank road companies.

SECTION 3. That Margaret Garret Kay, late Margaret Garret Keen, be and she is hereby authorized and empowered to have, hold, use, enjoy, grant and convey all and singular the estate, real and personal whatsoever, the title whereof is now under her ante-nuptial deed of settlement, (bearing date the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, recorded in the office for recording of deeds, et cetera, for Philadelphia county, in deed book G S, number thirty-six, page seven hundred and fourteen,) vested in trustees for her sole use for life; and after her death, for such uses as she shall appoint

by will, as fully and effectually as if no such deed had ever been executed.

SECTION 4. That the court of common pleas of the county of Washington shall have jurisdiction to receive the declination of Jacob Bellheimer, trustee of Susanna, late the wife of Jacob Stehly, and to settle all accounts connected with said trust, and from time to time to discharge, remove and appoint trustees, in the same manner as if the said Jacob Bellheimer had resided in said county at the commencement of the trust.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Wilkesbarre coal company;" relative to overseers of the poor in the borough of West Philadelphia; in relation to Archibald M'Millan, commissioner of Beaver; authorizing Mary Henning, of Union county, and Jeremiah Van Reed, Martin Landis, of Berks county, to sell certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Wilkesbarre coal company be permitted and authorized to increase their capital stock one hundred thousand dollars, and to issue bonds in the nature of certificates of loan, to an amount not exceeding, at any one time, one hundred thousand dollars, bearing interest at six per cent. per annum, and redeemable and payable within five years from their date: *Provided,* That to the extent of any sum of money which shall be subscribed to this increased capital stock, the company shall be taxed one per cent., payable in every case at the end of one year after the date of such subscription, to be appropriated to the same purposes as set forth in the original act incorporating the Wilkesbarre coal company.

SECTION 2. That the third section of the act, entitled "A supplement to the act to incorporate the borough of West Philadelphia, approved the first day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and forty-five," be and the same is hereby repealed.
