AN ACT

To encourage the destruction of crows in the county of Bedford, and relative to hunting and fishing in Huntingdon county, and to the borough of Orwigsburg, in Schuylkill county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, any person who may kill any Crows in Bedford or crows in the county of Bedford, in this commonwealth, and ford county, relative to. who shall produce the scalp or scalps before the treasurer of said county, whose duty it shall be, free of charge, and who is hereby fully empowered to examine such person or persons on oath or affirmation, touching the time when and the place where such crow or crows were taken and killed; and if within the said county of Bedford, then the said treasurer shall pay to such person or persons the sum of ten cents for every scalp that may be produced of a full grown crow, and the sum of five cents for those that are not full grown; and the receipts for such payments shall be allowed as vouchers to said treasurer in the settlement of his account with the commissioners of said county.

SECTION 2. That the second section of an act relating to hunting and Fishing in Juniata river, within county of Huntingdon, relative to. fishing in the counties of Huntingdon, Carbon, Luzerne, Dauphin, Mifflin, Elk, Pike, Monroe and Butler, approved the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. That the borough of Orwigsburg, in the county of Schuylkill, be and the same is hereby extended and enlarged according to the Borough of Orwigsburg, boundaries of extended. following boundaries, viz: beginning at a chestnut oak, a point in the present borough line; thence by land of Joseph Hoy south seventy-seven and a half degrees west one hundred and eighteen perches to a cherry tree, a corner on Abraham Fegly's land; thence by Joseph Hoy's land north twenty-two degrees west one hundred and thirteen perches to a public road; thence by land of Henry Hoy north twenty-eight and a half degrees west twenty-five perches to a cherry tree standing on the west side of the public road leading from Orwigsburg to Landingville; and that all the taxes now assessed, and hereafter to be assessed upon the real and personal estate embraced within the boundaries of said extension, shall be paid to the collectors of the borough aforesaid, in the same manner and for the same purposes that taxes are now paid by the citizens of the borough aforesaid.
